The Advent wreath is one way of preparing for the coming of the Christ child. The circle of greenery is a symbol of God's love, without beginning or end, while the candles represent the four weeks of preparation time. One candle is lit each Sunday during Advent, and the final, central candle is lit on Christmas Day

Our friendly volunteers are happy to assist with any enquiries and can help locate your favourite author or direct you to books on your favourite subject The Bookshop is currently open from 10am to 1pm Monday to Saturday but will resume normal hours on Monday 29th November. It will then operate from 10am to 4pm Monday to Friday and 10am to 1pm on Saturdays. It will close on 22nd December and reopen January 2022.
