MAKING IT WORK - TOGETHER

"Use what talents you possess: the woods would be very silent if no birds sang there except those that sang best." [Henry Van Dyke]


That quote is another take on the message in today's Gospel – various people have various talents, and all are called to use them, says Jesus. And elsewhere he would say that a very good way of using our talents is to build up life around us.

There are so many opportunities for that, of course – in our families, our workplace, our neighbourhood, our school, our society, our world, our Parish. The talents the Gospel speaks of mostly won't appear on shows like 'Australian Idol', 'X Factor' and 'Australia's Got Talent', 'The Voice'. Each of us has perhaps unexpected talents that we can apply to our call to make the Gospel of Jesus real.

The talents the Gospel admires and encourages are those that could be called 'life talents' – some of which are listed in another part of Jesus' teaching, the Beatitudes: the ability to make peace, to comfort others, to notice the needy and do something for them, to be compassionate, to be hopeful, to be thankful,

Our Parish community always needs to keep developing these 'life talents', of course – for we want to live the life of Jesus Christ. And when we speak of 'Parish community', we are speaking of the people who make up our Parish – you and me!

And aren't we so fortunate that so many of our Parishioners participate in Ministries for the good of our community, putting their talents at the service of others!

In the first step - Verify at the Post office (the online verification rarely works!)

Make sure to put down that you are a volunteer (its free of Charge)

Once you have filled all this in, you will receive an email to them to the email address you included.

You will receive an email that states your check has been received, and it has a "barcode" that you take to your local post office along with your Photo Identification to finalise the check. Once you do this (within 14 days go to the post office) you will get a further email to say your WWCC has passed. Then they will post a card also but this can take a few weeks. Don't Forget to provide a copy to your ministry leader or the parish office.

It is also a requirement of the Archdiocese to complete online training at:
