REFLECTION

Hmmmmm ... what happens next?

At this time each year the Readings wonder about 'the end' and what it might be like. Here is writer Billy Farrelly's version:

I have a theory: I think that Judas Iscariot may well be in heaven. I am not prepared to stick my neck out and speculate about Hitler of Pol Pot or any one of a dozen others. But I would take a punt on Judas.

Would you be embarrassed if you met Judas? I wouldn't. I'd be relieved. It would affirm what you and I already know: God's mercy is infinite- and so it can reach you and me.

It's so easy to judge, isn't it? I try not to judge, and not to act or form opinions loosely, but I know there are times I slip – and sometimes very seriously. If I become aware quickly I can make amends and forgive myself; but I wonder: how often do I err and remain ignorant? Then I have to rely on the infinite mercy of God.

But let's get back to Judas. On second thoughts, let me digress a moment longer. Did you ever believe in Limbo? I guess I was quite young when I first learnt about Limbo but it simply made no sense to me. Why would God create a place where He Himself was essentially excluded? Why would He punish a child or an adult — His own creation — who never had the opportunity to learn about Him here on Earth? So I never believed in Limbo. My teachers were wrong. Decades later the Church made it clear — trust in the infinite love of God. [*In 1992 the official Catechism of the Catholic Church omitted mention of Limbo; then Pope Benedict definitely excluded it: it was never formally part of Church doctrine!]

The point I am making is that we often get things wrong. Judas got it wrong. He let greed overwhelm him, the way I have allowed selfishness and self-pity to overwhelm me sometimes. Jesus taught often about God's forgiveness. Will that change at 'the end'? I don't think so!
