# REFLECTION

## BE PREPARED ... AND GET INTO IT

Our lives have many dilemmas in them, some of which are raised in this weekend's Word of God. Do I prepare and wait, or do I throw myself into it now? Do I consider death and thereafter, or do I get on with living live my life here and now?

It's not fair to suggest that we have to choose between these points in a dilemma – for there is great value in both parts of these issues. Do I put my efforts into our relationship as husband and wife, or do I focus on our children and what they need?

These double questions which occur throughout our lives show the wisdom of our tradition of faith which tells us that we are 'both-and' people - that it's important to have a broad grasp on life because it is complex, and if I focus too much on one aspect, I may be relinquishing involvement and responsibility in another part.

The Scout Movement\* and the Guide Movement have as their mottoes 'Be Prepared' - and that is John the Baptist's message in today's Advent gospel reading and in the First Reading.

The founder of the movement didn't leave it there: "Be *Prepared* so that you know the right thing to do at the right moment, and are willing to do it, making yourself strong and active and able to do the right thing at the right moment; be prepared at any moment to face difficulties and even dangers by knowing what to do and how to do iť".

One way to take up this advice is to listen for the Wisdom of God, as our First Reading proposes. That is what prayer is largely for, as well as praising and thanking God for the gifts we share and anticipate.

### ST VINCENT DE PAUL GIVING TREE


