REFLECTION

What is your image of God?

We are familiar with that repeated proclamation in the New Testament that 'God is love'. At times the image of God presented in other places is different from this, however.

References to God on TV or some other popular media – and even in some Christian spiritualities (!) sometimes present a judging, revengeful, punishing God. This sort of image can play well when so much violence and revenge are presented for our entertainment, and in real time across our world. Perhaps it's easier to deal with a God who is perceived to be 'on the opposition'. Perhaps it's easier to dismiss God as irrelevant, not needed, or to be feared if we can paint God in that sort of image thunderclaps, bolts of lightning and booming, disapproving voice from above. It's much harder to dismiss a God of love who will go to extremes to demonstrate that love, coming amongst us in Jesus, drawing us further into God's own life!

Today's gospel passage tells us that God's Son was not sent into the world to condemn it, but rather, 'so that through him the world might be saved'. This drives the actions and teachings of Jesus. Jesus is to be our primary reference point: it's Jesus who shows us and tells us what God is like.

God does not condemn the world, nor individuals within it. Indeed, God is absolutely determined to save the world. However, we do sometimes condemn ourselves. When we turn our back on love; when we persist in selfishness - we shut ourselves off from relationship with God and condemn ourselves.

During Lent, God invites us to recognise God's own uplifting, empowering, patient love for us.

Like our symbol of the twisted willow in our churches, our sometimes inaccurate images of God may be another 'old leaf' to discard so that a new one may grow.


