Two great Easter stories in the Word of God today:

'Curious' Thomas (I think the term 'doubting' Thomas does him a disservice) wants to experience the Risen Christ more. And the earliest Christians are committed to their community life and the wellbeing of those around them.

As Jesus became like us, may we now become like Him! For "He is risen!" ... and, having celebrated that, they are changed!

An example: Speaking of the Christians before the Emperor Hadrian in the early second century, Aristides, a non-Christian, said of them:

"These Christians love one another. They never fail to help widows. They save orphans from those who would hurt them. If people have something, they give that freely to anyone who has nothing. If they see a stranger, Christians take that person into their homes and treat them as a brother or sister. And if they hear that one of them is in jail, or persecuted for professing the name of their redeemer, they all give those people what they need. If it is possible, they bail them out. If one of them is poor and there isn't enough food to go around, they fast several days to give their food to the other person. We are dealing with a new kind of person: there is something divine in them!"

Now is the time for those good intentions we made during Lent to become new realities in our lives. Now that we have celebrated Easter it is time to put them into practice! We have seven weeks ahead of 'Easter Season' to build that Easter spirit, hope and action into our lives. Blessings for continuing Easter-ing!!



<u>A reading from the holy Gospel</u> according to John [21:1-14]

Jesus showed himself again to the disciples. It was by the Sea of Tiberias, and it happened like this: Simon Peter, Thomas, Nathanael, the sons of Zebedee and two more of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said, 'I'm going fishing.' They replied, 'We'll come with you.' They went out and got into the boat but caught nothing that night. It was light by then and there stood Jesus on the shore, though the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus called out, 'Have you caught anything, friends?' The disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord'.

<u>A reading from the holy Gospel</u> according to Mark [16:9-15]

Having risen in the morning on the first day of the week, Jesus appeared first to Mary of Magdala. She then went to those who had been his companions and told them. After this, he showed himself under another form to two of them as they were on their way into the country.
