## **REFLECTION**

# Ordinary ... but in a special way!

What a cast of characters fills the Advent readings, on weekdays and Sundays! An unorthodox prophet, who doesn't come from the religious establishment and who attracts crowds in the desert – this John the Baptist comes back again this weekend into the gospel reading. And there are the homeowner, a Roman centurion, fishermen, a shepherd, a paralytic, a son who rethinks his original 'no' to his father, an unwed mother, her puzzled fiancé, her older pregnant cousin and two babies.

Ordinary people ... just like us! Look how ordinary people have a role in the unfolding story of God's being amongst the people. In case you might think that they are somehow 'specially chosen and set apart', think of the preaching of Jesus as he repeatedly surrounds himself with 'ordinary' people. And he entrusts the mission of his kingdom to them. This is the way that John the Baptist (who was a bit unusual!) appears this week – preaching the coming of God amongst the people.

Remember those words of St Francis of Assisi: 'you are to be preaching the presence of Christ always: if necessary you might occasionally have to use words'.

Yes: by the way we live our lives we can be like John the Baptist, being a sort of light, shining in the lives of others by the way we are with them – hopeful, positive, supporting, compassionate, enjoyable. He did that in his own particular way. And people came to him for his baptism.

Mary MacKillop had John the Baptist as one of her favourites. What are the ways you can be this sort of pointer – showing that the coming of Christ and his Way are really in our world? Whatever it means to you in your circumstances, John asks us all to consider what in our lives assists the coming of the Kingdom of God.
