REFLECTION

How many times should I forgive? Really??

The call of the gospel is so demanding at times. Last week's Word urged us to stand up for the values and actions which we consider to be right; today's Word now asks us to forgive those who act against us! There is a tension between these two. However this is how God is towards us – the call is to us to live truly as part of the People of God.

Some find it difficult to forgive because they fear that such a decision will convey the impression that forgiveness approves the behaviour of the offender. Forgiveness does not address the wrongdoing of the offender. It speaks of the courage, compassion, wisdom and mercy of the forgiver. When Pope John Paul II forgave his would be assassin, Mehmet All Agca, he never indicated that Agca's actions were justifiable. Some things that people do are not right!

The motivation for forgiving includes the factor that we need to be healed ourselves – from the heavy burden of carrying a grudge, which runs the risk of turning us into a negative person. We want to be whole and to be people of hope and life. Jesus said that he had come that we might have life and have it to the full. Retaining anger drains that very life from us.

"I'm not asking you to forgive that person because what they did was acceptable; it was hurtful and selfish. I'm asking you to forgive because you're letting that person live in your head and turn you into a bitter, angry person."

Lord, accepting Your forgiveness is easy for us. You pardon us and we feel great peace and joy. It is like walking tall again. But being the forgiver of others who have offended us is not so easy for us. Help us break through the difficulty of forgiving. We know your promise to forgive us - give us your strength to shake off whatever it is in us that has us digging our heels in and holds us bound. And so may your new life be renewed around us!
