REFLECTION

LENT IS ALMOST OVER!

Some words from the late Archbishop of Westminster in London:

LENT is a time during which we have looked forward to the celebrations of Holy Week, that is, to the joy of Easter, the triumph of Christ our Lord over death and over sin. That is our great joy – that is the foundation of all our hope.

There is also another looking forward, which is part of Christian living and one to which we turn our attention in particular during Lent, and it is the looking forward to heaven, to the time when we shall be totally, wholly with God.

So, a 'turning to God' is such a significant part of this Lenten journey we have been sharing for almost forty days now. How important it is in travelling through Lent that there should be resolutions of a very positive nature. Turning away from what separates us from God. The most dangerous thing is pride: I will not serve; I make myself the centre of my life; I want my way; I want things to go the way I think they ought to. The second great sin is unkindness – lack of charity, lack of love.

There is a third thing that separates us from God, which you might mind surprising – grumbling. I learnt this from the Rule of St Benedict, which is constantly telling monks that they must not be grumblers. This is very shrewd. There is nothing worse than living with people who grumble; there is nothing more corrosive than grumbling; nothing more unsettling than grumbling.

Let our Lent conclude with our determination to turn to God, knowing that to turn to God is to receive an outpouring of God's own love.
