# REFLECTION

#### **JOSEPH**

The birth of Jesus in Matthew's gospel [which we will be reading throughout the coming year] has Joseph in its focus. It is through Joseph that Jesus comes into the House of David. It is Joseph who receives an annunciation that the child has been conceived through the power of the Holy Spirit.

In the Old Testament there was a Joseph who had dreams, who looked after his family, and went down into Egypt, which is where this Joseph will later take Mary and Jesus. There is such a strong connection between the story of Jesus and the story of the Old Testament people. Both our First Reading (from the Old Testament) and Gospel Reading this weekend proclaim 'Emmanuel' – that God-is-with-us, and now in Jesus.

Jesus begins his life as many children do – in the midst of hopes and anxiety, and much that is unknown. The future lies hidden from Joseph, as the future of any child lies hidden from parents. Joseph trusts this future into God's hands.

Perhaps this is an attitude we can take up at Christmas. When we look at the crib scenes of the child resting peacefully in a manger, or in the arms of Mary with Joseph watching over, dare we believe that we can rest as peacefully in the arms of God? As Mary MacKillop wrote: "Do all you can with the means at your disposal and calmly leave the rest to God."
