REFLECTION


What sort of Supporter are you?

In the last several weeks the Word of God has invited us to reflect on the ways we relate to others around us - offering various strategies for consideration, always looking to God's way as the model, taught to us be Jesus. Today's Word asks us to check our integrity and the consistency between our words and actions. It's been an AFL season of surprises, and it's been a tight Finals struggle, hasn't it? Once your own team hasn't made 'the Eight', or has made it that far and is then knocked out in the early Finals, you can change your mind several times about who is going to take off the Grand Final, and give them your support.

However you never give up on your own team, do you? Players can change clubs, coaches can come and go and surface at a different club, even coaching their new team against their previous one. But supporters really don't have that option - you stick with your club through it all!

Today's Gospel story tries to sort through this in our attitude to Jesus and his mission. If we have committed to the way of the Gospel, then stick with that come what may, whatever situation you're in. However, if you have been a bit half-hearted about it, you can change your mind and 'get on board' - come on, there's room for you, we'll have you - it's never too last, as last weekend's Gospel taught! That was the Gospel story of the workers who came late to the vineyard, do you remember? Conversion is depicted as a change of mind, a change of heart in this weekend's parable of two sons and their father. At first one son refused to work, then he changed his mind, thought better of it. When you say 'yes' to living out our Christian


When you say 'yes' to living out our Christian Faith, then do it! If you've been a bit slack about it, there's still time - get on board!
