REFLECTION

BEING FAITH-FILLED CITIZENS

The Word of God turns to our social context this weekend: we are citizens of our society, and we are also disciples of Christ. This does not imply a conflict, surely – for our life of faith describes who we are in all things! The teaching of our Church recognises that "The split between the faith which many profess and their daily lives deserves to be counted among the more serious errors of our age."

Second Vatican Council, Church in the Modern World, 43

Rather, remembering that Jesus came 'that all may have life and have it to the full', we are to be life-givers in all aspects of our lives. That means that we will be active to build our spiritual life in our prayer and in our celebration of the Sacraments. And then part of our spiritual life is being life-givers to those in need, too: 'when I was hungry, thirsty, broken-hearted, lonely ... what did you do?' – that will be the question as we prepare to enter eternal life. And there's that oft-repeated instruction of Mary MacKillop's: 'Never see a need without doing something about it'.

One of the roles of governments is to be 'life-givers'. For this they need income from taxes. One of our roles is to keep governments true to their mission. There is to be no opposition between 'religion' and 'government'. Our lives of faith can offer wisdom to governments as they take decisions — hopefully for the good of all, with particular care for the poor and needy.
