### REFLECTION

# ITS NOT FAIR!

That's the cry of people in the Scriptures who want things to go the way they think they should go – and they find out that they're not in control. They have to realise that GOD has a role in all this. And, as today's First Reading says, "My thoughts are not your thoughts, my ways are not your ways – it is the Lord who speaks!" Indeed "The heavens are as high above earth as My ways are above your ways, My thoughts above your thoughts."

'But that's not fair,' we say – we know how things should work!

Jesus' parable in the Gospel features workers in a vineyard. Those who turn up early are outraged when latecomers received the same wages. This teaching was recorded in Matthew's Gospel when there was great antagonism between the Jews who became followers of Jesus and the non-Jews, the 'Gentiles' who heard the Gospel of Jesus later. Jewish Christians looked at their long history of hardship preparing for the coming of the Messiah. And, now, here were these Gentiles who had done nothing by comparison, and God appeared to be granting them the same welcome into the Kingdom!

God's ways are different from ours! Which is good news if we haven't been perfect all through our lives, and are a bit like those 'slackers' who turned up late - God welcomes us all into the life the New Life that Christ brings!

God, we thank you that heaven is not earth, and especially that grace does not abide by our rules. We are grateful that Your ways are not ours.

You are generous without restraint. You overpay and overpay. Instead of giving us our just rewards, you heap on us the fortunes of Your everlasting life and love. Lord, lavish on us your spirit of generosity. Help **us** then to give and never count the cost.

What of our relationships with those around us, particularly those who don't measure up to our standards. The model is God – patient, continuing to put out the call, not judging harshly along the way but offering another chance. Thank God that God is like this to us!


