REFLECTION

Holy Week to Easter: What a week!!


As we take up the palms this weekend, we mark the beginning of HOLY WEEK. Just that title suggests that we are invited to enter this time with reverence and to celebrate its rites with wonder, care and devotion.

The 'events' include the Blessing of the Oils by the Archbishop for our use in the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Anointing of the Sick during the year until next Easter. These Oils will be presented to our community on Holy Thursday.

The 'Triduum' is the single ceremony that spreads over the three days of Holy Thursday-Good Friday-Easter Vigil, and Easter Eucharist. We do not merely remember these days in the life of Jesus - his Last Supper, his arrest, torture and death on the cross, and his being raised to new life: we also reflect on, claim anew and celebrate the new life that He has brought to us for our own lives.

Jesus, Son of God, was born into the human experience of which we all are part, and in him we are raised into a new way of being: "In him a new age has dawned, the long reign of sin is ended, a broken world has been renewed, and we are once again made whole!" (4th Preface of Easter). We have several adults preparing for Baptism-Confirmation-Eucharist at Easter time in our Parish this year. As they begin their full participation in the life of faith and the Church in which we all share, may Holy Week-Easter celebrations renew us all in our journey of shared faith!

AL-ANON FAMILY GROUPS AND ALATEEN

If your home is unhappy because a loved one drinks too much, there is help available! An Al-Anon Family Group in Sydenham offers hope and help to families who are seeking support. Confidentiality is assured. A voluntary donation is requested to help cover the rental of the room.

TWO Introductory Alateen meetings will be offered during 1st term school holidays for teens (age 12/13 – 18/19) who live with a parent or sibling whose drinking causes problems / anxiety in the family.

Alateen meetings are facilitated by two certified and experienced Al-Anon members (who have WWCC & Police Checks).

Parents/ Guardians are invited to accompany their teens and attend the adult Al-Anon meeting in an adjacent room. Alateen members gain strength and hope listening to other teens share their stories and soon realise that they are not alone. As in the parent group, confidentiality is assured.
