#### REFLECTION

# LENT - the journey has begun

The story of the 'transfiguration' of Jesus comes in various forms each year on the Second Sunday of Lent. It's a complex story with elements of suffering, glory, ominous foreboding, grateful memory, challenge, prayer, confusion, the enduring commitment of God, ... That mixture makes it such a good story for Lent – after all, all those elements are in our lives and in our lives of faith which Lent invites us to review and be renewed in.

One writer reflects: 'The journeys of our lives have mountain steepness when the climb tires us and the summit seems so far off – like trying to understand those we love, trying to create some sort of better world, trying to live up to the call of God.'

And we glimpse glory along the way, too – like the joy of understandings shared, small triumphs of justice and compassion, the feeling of the strength of God shared with us in prayer, the warmth and uplift of someone's love for us.

God is with us through all of these journeys, caring for us in all troubles, offering us the Word of life, naming each of us as beloved daughter, beloved son. Through the Season of Lent may we listen to God's Word, the Word of comfort in trouble, of challenge in our routine, of joy in our blessings, of God's faithfulness to us always.

Mountaintops and hillsides appear quite often in the span of the Scriptures. For Jesus they are places for prayer, for preaching, for death, for ascension, and – in today's gospel – for transformation. That last one is what Lent call us all to!

The real question is whether the 'brighter future' is really always so distant. What if, on the contrary, it has been here for a long time already, and only our own blindness and weakness have prevented us from seeing it around us and within us, and kept us from developing it? (Vaclav Havel, later President of Czechoslovakia, The Power of the Powerless, 1978)


