<u>HAPPY NEW YEAR!</u>

Advent – commencing today – is the season of new beginnings. A new Year for the Church calendar begins today, Year B – during which the gospel of Mark will give shape to many of the Sunday readings. Advent is the season of new beginnings. There are many 'new years': birthdays, school year, financial year. There are many 'beginnings' –school, job, further study, retirement,

... Advent is the Church's 'new year', the season to consider a new beginning, re-telling the story aagain from its origins.


Advent always beckons us into this new beginning with images of transformation and hope. It is the season of the impossible becoming possible, leading into our celebration of the birth into our human situation of the Son of God! It will give us stories of great people of hope — John the Baptist, Mary, Joseph, the prophets. Advent is a season of iov, hope, determination and waiting.

Whereas last Sunday spoke of Christ becoming 'Lord of All – the King' when all is fulfilled, this First Sunday of Advent takes us back before the birth of Jesus as we begin to re-tell and celebrate again his life amongst us.

Instead of waiting for 1st January to make 'new year's resolutions', consider beginning with Advent. In your prayer, consider what beginning you would like to make in your life, taking the Gospel of Jesus as a quide.

We mark the beginning of Advent each year, by changing the Church colours to the purple - a time of preparation, and a time for spiritual "putting our hearts in order to be open to Christ amongst us," surely a gift of joy — Christ has come to us!!
