REFLECTION

November reminds us of the reality of death ... and resurrection:

So they're working on a pill that will enable us to live up to 150 years old - that was in the news a while back, beside an article on 'assisted dying' !! Firstly, do you want to live to be 150? And think of the people around you – do you want them to be 150?

And secondly, we will all have to die at some time or other: That pill may be able to delay the time of our death ... however we will die: that is part of the overall story of life, just as being born is part of the story.

Ah! There it is again: when we speak of death, we often use similar language to what we use about birth – "born to eternal life"! There is a parable about twins in the womb wondering and anxious about what comes next - 'is there life after birth?' one asks. And then they are born into a new way of living; and those who had loved them all along loved them still and forever! We speak of death in a very similar way - there is new life after life here!

In the gospels, there are marvellous stories about the likes of Lazarus, and Jairus' daughter, and the widow's son being brought back to life - they will have to die again one day. The resurrection of Jesus is about being raised into new life - and that's different.

Throughout November we will be remembering those who have gone ahead of us through death into New Life.

The Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation 1 prays this way: support us "until we too stand before you, Saints among the Saints in the halls of heaven"! And another prayer:

Eternal God, by whose mercy and grace your saints remain in everlasting light and peace: I remember with

thanksgiving (name your person here) and all those whom I love but see no longer. I commit them to your love and peace in the new life of resurrection which Jesus Christ has opened for us. Amen

"Whoever exalts himself will be humbled: but whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

Steps for New Special Communion Ministers to apply for Working with Children Checks (WWCC): Visit this webpage on your computer: https://wwcv.auspost.com.au/ In the first step - Verify at the Post office (the online verification rarely works!) Make sure to put down that you are a volunteer (its free of Charge) Organisations details - Sacred Heart Emmaus Parish - 4 Winifred Street, St Albans VIC 3021 phone: 0393662146 Occupational Fields is number 64 "Religious organisation" Once you have filled all this in, you will receive an email to them to the email address you included. You will receive an email that states your check has been received, and it has a "barcode" that you take to your local post office along with your Photo Identification to finalise the check. Once you do this (within 14 days go to the post office) you will get a further email to say your WWCC has passed. Then they will post a card also but this can take a few weeks. Don't Forget to provide a copy to your ministry leader or the parish office. It is also a requirement of the Archdiocese to complete online training at: https://safeguarding.melbournecatholic.org/s/login/?ec=302&startURL=%2Fs%2F and sign the Parish Code of conduct - copies of this are in the Sacristy or contact the Parish office.
