#### IT COSTS!!


Last weekend's Gospel Reading gave us the situation of 'yes and no': saying that I will do something, yet not following through to action. In this weekend's Gospel Reading, Jesus' parable shows God's persistence in bring about 'the good fruits of the kingdom', sending even his Son to bring that to reality. Jesus, we are told elsewhere, is true to the plan 'that they may have life and have it to the full', even when that commitment leads him towards arrest, torture, and execution. Over the past several weeks the Word of God has identified some of the difficulties involved for us in helping to build up the kingdom of God – because that involves our living with others, and it involves our sorting out own intentions and actions.

However God doesn't give up.

The disciples of Christ are called to do likewise – to keep living the Gospel of Christ in our lives, even when it costs.

Again and again you send your servants into the vineyard with messages of love, justice, hope. Nothing quenches the fire you cast in them, not rejection, suspicion, scorn or contempt.



Our Church's 'Synod on Synodality' gathers in Rome this week

A synod is a meeting – usually of Bishops- gathered to discuss a topic of theological or pastoral significance in order to prepare a document of advice or counsel to the Pope. For the first time, , about 21% of the voting delegates in this 2023 Synod of Bishops on Synodality will not be Bishops - included are laypeople, priests, Religious women, and deacons.selected by the leadership of this year's preparatory continental synod meetings. This October assembly will be held in the Paul VI Hall with delegates sitting at round tables of about 10 people each. A prayer: "We stand before you, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in your name. With you alone to guide us, make yourself at home in our hearts; teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in you our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of you, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen.'
