

Social Justice Sunday

The last weekend in August each year is **Social Justice Sunday**, with an accompanying Statement from our Bishops - this year's Statement is: *Respect: Confronting Violence and Abuse*. It invites us to engage with a complex and confronting social reality. It explores the roots of violence and abuse, honours the voices of victims, offers a social and theological exploration of the reality of violence, especially against women and children, and invites us to develop relationships in all parts of our lives 'marked by equality and reciprocity rather than domination and violence, respect and freedom rather than coercion and control.'
