CHAPLAINCY SUNDAY APPEAL Sunday 20th May 2018

The Melbourne Catholic Archbishop's Charitable Fund is conducting its annual Chaplaincy Sunday Appeal in parishes to support the vital work of Catholic Chaplains in our community this Sunday 20th May 2018.

Our focus for 2018 is Prison Chaplaincy. The relationship and collaboration between prisoners and Chaplains whilst they are in prison is vital to restoring them back onto the road again to re-join society with dignity and self-respect, with a sense of hope and responsibility for new pathways, with a sense of personal power and control over their own life, and hopefully with new skill sets and options.

The following statistics show what chaplaincy services are provided and how your donation helps:

Prison Chaplaincy: 267 hours weekly of direct support to prisoners, women and men, across the 15 prisons in metro and regional Victoria.

Youth Justice: We have been able to maintain 47 hours per week of direct support to children and young people across the two Youth Justice Custodial Centres in Parkville and Malmsbury.

Healthcare Chaplaincy: Has increased to 128 hours weekly of direct support to patients and their families across 6 major state run hospitals as well as the support of 23 Parishes across Melbourne Archdiocese and other Dioceses with major state run hospitals within their boundaries.

HIV/AIDS Ministry: Over 100 people visited at home or in hospital with a total of 157 people receiving care; some 375 people attend the Monday lunch throughout the year at the St Mary of the Cross Centre in Fitzroy.

2018 is the Year of Youth: The Creed in Slow Motion XV

His only Son (3)

You may have an objection to make here. You'll remind me that I told you earlier that God couldn't do things that are inconceivable; he couldn't make a thing, for example, which was at the same time round and square. How, then, could a Being exist who was both God and Man?

The answer to that is, that we have to make a distinction. Jesus Christ was both human and Divine, but in different ways. His nature was human, his person was Divine. That is what we mean by the Hypostatic Union. When we say the Litany of the Sacred Heart, we say: "Heart of Jesus, hypostatically united to the word of God", not knowing very much what it means.

Hypo is something you use for developing photographs; and statics are a kind of higher mathematics. But none of that helps us much. Hypostatically united means personally united. It means that Jesus Christ has a human nature, but in person he is Divine.

A Divine Person with a human nature – and therefore a Divine Person with two natures, one human and one Divine. Our Lord couldn't stop being God when he became man. He was still reigning, as God, in heaven, when our Lady was wrapping him up in his swaddling clothes at Bethlehem.

You say: That's very confusing." I should just think it was. Nothing I can suggest in the way of illustration can really be of any use, simply because the Hypostatic Union is something unlike anything else in existence; it is a closer, more intimate union than anything we can imagine. Our Lady is united to God by love; how close that bond is! But in the Incarnation you have a union closer than love itself.

The same person on earth may hold two different positions, two different titles: as the Queen is both Queen of England and Queen of Australia; but in the Incarnation it is not a question of two different titles, two different positions; it is a question of two natures, two modes of being.

You read stories sometimes of people being possessed by devils, and being exorcised. In those stories, it seems as if the devil managed to take complete control of the possessed person, spoke with his voice, looked out of his eyes, thought with his mind. But always, even in such a case as that, the human personality is there, must be there, even though it's driven (so to speak) into a corner. But in the Incarnate Christ, though there is a human mind, a human soul, there is no human personality. The Person you see at Bethlehem or on Calvary is God. Nothing in our human experience can be used to illustrate that mystery. But it is a mystery, not a contradiction.

You'll find as you grow up, and get talking to Protestants more and find out what they think about religion, that they are nearly all wrong about our topic today. They will start by telling you that they believe our Lord was God, but when you question them a little more closely you'll find that many of them think he was a very good man, so good that he was allowed (I'm going to be irreverent again) to enjoy a kind of honorary rank as God. Some of them think it happened when he was baptised, if you remember, in the Jordan, and the Holy Spirit came down on him there in the form of a dove. That, they will tell you, is when our Lord started to be God. But, you see, that's nonsense really.

If the Baby who lay in the crib at Bethlehem was a human person, then it was a human person who hung on the Cross, and your sins and mine have never been properly atoned for, because human sin is an infinite offence to the majesty of God, and you can't atone for an infinite offence by a finite act of reparation.

No, God's only Son, wishing to make reparation in full for our fault, took a human nature upon him, because that was the only way in which it was possible for him to suffer.

It was like the action of some rich man who makes himself responsible for the debts of a bankrupt, because he thinks those debts ought to be paid. Like that, only different, because the condescension was much greater, because the price Jesus paid cost him his life.

"Greater love hath no man than this," he tells us, "that a man should lay down his life for his friends." No man, but, being God, he took a human life in order to be able to lay it down; and to lay it down for us, who were not then his friends, but his enemies.
