

## FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR B - 2nd/3rd December, 2023

#### **REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA**

Today's readings contain several images: the faithfulness of those who suffer, even as they lament their predicament; the admonition to watch and wait; the expectation of the coming of the Day of the Lord. As trustees of the one who is coming, we live in the 'in between' time of ambiguity and hope. The placement of these readings at the beginning



of Advent shapes the context for understanding the entire season. They fix our gaze on the world of human pain and then moves beyond it to the hope of a brighter future. Lamentation and expectation find fulfilment in the Day of the Lord.

Waiting is a prominent image this Sunday. Some people wait to be released from suffering, others await the second coming of Christ. Waiting saps our energies and stifles our enthusiasm. Yet wait we must, and as we wait, we wonder: 'What should I be doing?' The readings suggest that we should wait with patient expectation for the day of reconciliation and peace; we should wait in joyful hope that what is to come will come soon. While we wait, we should faithfully fulfil our responsibilities. We believe that we have a future worth waiting for, that there are promises that God will keep. And so we look expectantly to the Day of the Lord, that future day of ultimate fulfilment.

#### AN IMPORTANT NOTICE relating to the PARISH

The Mass centre at the top of Mount Dandenong, St Clare's Catholic Church, has not been used as a Mass centre for quite a number of years. It was closed because the number of people attending each week was minimal and simply put, it was not practical to continue to have Masses said there. The church and surrounding grounds, however, still remain an asset of the Parish, which must be maintained, insured and kept to a building standard.

In a time when parish funds continue to dwindle and the maintenance costs of our other four Mass centres continue to rise, the Parish finance committee has taken advice and would like to proceed with the realisation of this asset so that it can generate future funds for the benefit of the Parish.

At the moment three options are under consideration

**Option one** is to enter into a long-term business (property) lease for St Clares, use the rental income to then take out a loan to build houses /flats on existing parish land in Emerald for renting to parishoners, which in turn would return a long-term income for the parish.

**Option two** is to use the income from the Clare's Church to help maintain our Parish.

**Option three** would be to sell St Clare's outright and invest the money realised to provide a future income for the Parish.

Before these options can be considered, however, the Archbishop must relegate the Church for profane use (say it can be used for non -religious purposes). The first step in seeking such a process is to demonstrate that the Parish as a whole supports the relegation.

The Parish finance committee is therefore seeking your support to undertake a process. We ask you to complete a simple survey which contains three questions:

- Q1. Are you in favour of having St Clares Church being relegated for profane (ordinary) use
- Q2. Are you in favour of a long-term lease to provide a future income for the Parish
- Q3. Are you in favour of selling St Clares Church to provide an income for the Parish? This will be a longer process.

You can respond to these questions via one of several ways.

- Filling in the form overleaf and leave this in the collection plant during the next three sundays
- OR You can complete a simple survey via a google form, <u>St Clares Catholic Church Parish Survey</u>
