So they took Jeremiah and threw him into the well of Prince Malchiah in the Court of the Guard, letting him down with ropes. There was no water in the well, only mud, and into the mud Jeremiah sank.

Ebed-melech came out from the palace and spoke to the king. 'My lord king,' he said, 'these men have done a wicked thing by treating the prophet Jeremiah like this: they have thrown him into the well where he will die.' At this the king gave Ebedmelech the Cushite the following order: 'Take three men with you from here and pull the prophet Jeremiah out of the well before he dies.'

Homily for the Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

The readings for 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C tell us that discipleship can cause division and that we will have people pulling us in different directions. In the first reading we see how Jeremiah was thrown in a cistern for speaking the truth, but finally a court official speaks up for him. In the second reading Paul reminds us of all of the opposition Jesus endured. In the gospel Jesus tells us that he has come up to disrupt our lives and shake us out of complacency.

Fire often represents God. We see the Holy Spirit as tongues of fire. In the Old Testament, we see God in a pillar of fire and in the burning bush. Even in our liturgical worship today, fire plays and important role. We have the Easter candle and baptismal candles, representing the light of Christ.

Fire has the power to transform. It can melt wax or purify metals. It can protect, for example by cooking bacteria out of food. But it can also destroy, especially when it is not treated with respect. And it can disrupt.

But fire can also be peaceful. Think of being mesmerized by a campfire blazing in front of you. It provides warmth and light. In this case, a blazing fire is comforting.

This is the call of the Christian. We must get caught up in beauty of the fire of our Lord. This will transform us, possibly in ways which we do not expect. It will disrupt our current ways of thinking and doing things. But some disruption can be good, and can help us see what needs to change in our lives.
