# Have you thought?

#### Waiting, waiting, waiting ...

I'm not a big fan of waiting! Anticipation is pretty good; getting prepared and getting ready are OK, too. But when is comes down to being all dressed up and ready to go, I'm just hopeless at waiting. If Advent is a time of pointless waiting for Christmas then we've somehow missed the message. Rather than just waiting. Advent is a time of preparation and anticipation. But it's not just about anticipating Christmas. That's part of it, sure. However, Advent is about reminding ourselves that we have a job to do: preparing for the reign of God - in our lives and in our world.

#### YEAR C - INTRODUCING LUKE

The Gospel focuses upon the second coming of the Lord. It is full of the kind of apocalyptic descriptions and portents that have always excited the fundamentalist religious imagination and create difficulties for preachers today. The important thing, I think, is to focus upon the basic intent of such discourse, which is to address the sense of dismay and challenge to hope that calamities of various kinds present. While God may appear to be silent or absent, somehow all these things are held within the divine purpose, which will ultimately win through. While the basic message, then, is one of comfort, the second part of the gospel adopts a more admonitory tone. Believers must be like people expecting visitors but unsure as to when exactly they will arrive. The time of waiting requires attentiveness and a sharp spiritual sense. Anything that dulls the spirit (debauchery and drunkenness) or causes it to be distracted (absorption in the cares of life) must be avoided.

Advent is a time for examination in such areas. It is also a time for exploring our deepest longings and desires and allowing them to surface. They can ride up, so to speak, on the scripture texts that the Church puts before us at this time.

#### PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL REPORT:

Dear parishioners,

The newly formed Parish Pastoral Council held its first meeting on 13 November. The intention of the meeting was to understand the current environment and the issues surrounding the parish generally as well as the individual Mass centres, and understand the best way to support Father Geoff.

Overall weekly mass attendance is around 350 people, with declines in parishioner numbers being observed for several years now. This decline is also being felt in the parish schools. The low attendance rate (~ 5%) of Catholics in the Dandenongs however means an opportunity exists to connect with our broader community and reignite their interest in the Church.

Our intention is to explore ways to grow our parish by increasing the value of community and enlivening this community in a joyful way. Initial thoughts are to make the current range of social and social welfare current activities of the parish more visible; using programs to assist parishioners in their faith journey; providing peripheral support to allow a journey back to church, and addressing issues such as loneliness and isolation. We will further develop these ideas and initiatives in the coming months and believe they will also have a positive impact on our parish schools.

Communication is a critical element in delivering any outcome, and the use of electronic communications, social media and the parish website is seen as necessary to connect with people in the current environment. Please feel free to discuss any issues with your centre representatives or myself, and please pray for us in this important time of formation. Sincerely,
