Entrance Antiphon Acts 1:11

Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Acts 1:1-11

Why are you standing here looking into the sky?

Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.' Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.' As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go The word of the Lord. there.'

He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.



REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

The feast of the Ascension is really a kind of liminal moment in the Easter season. It is a time between times, a moment when we have left one place in our journey but have not yet arrived at a second. The glory of the Risen Christ has already been revealed in us, but not yet totally. The feast itself celebrates the exaltation of Jesus. Today we stand awestruck, watching Jesus ascend into the clouds of heaven, there to be enthroned at the right hand of God. Today we are overwhelmed by the reality of the divinity of the one whom we have known in his humanity. Like the conquering creatorgod, he has overcome his enemy (death) and now reigns over his new creation (the church).

Christ who ascended into heaven in his body carries on what he began on earth through his new body, the church. He teaches through its apostles and evangelists. He ministers through its prophets and pastors. In and through the church, Jesus continues to heal and to comfort; to forgive and



to include. We have not been left alone; we have his power, the same power with which he performed marvels when he walked the earth. We have not been left alone; we have each other. Together we make up the new body of Christ. Together we await the fullness of this body. It is this new body that stands in between the times, secure in what we have, confident of what we will be given.

Our Parish Social Justice Group was formed in 2002, under the leadership of Sister Maureen Keating, SGS. In the 20 years that followed we worked hard to represent the parish in numerous outreach and support programs, in accordance with our Mission Statement.

From 2008 until 2020, with the help of teams from within and outside the parish, we ran Tucker in the Tin Shed, which served a hot, two course meal to people experiencing hardship in the Hills area. We offered friendship and entertainment and we met many memorable personali-

We held Sausage Sizzles, Book Fairs, Car Boot Sales and Cake Stalls to raise money for East Timor, Wellsprings for Women, Opening the Door Foundation and the Salesian Missions. We recently supported meals held in Emerald to raise money for Seekers of Asylum and Ukraine.

We supported a young Filipino Nursing student to complete her studies. She is now working in the Paediatric ICU department of a hospital in Saudi Arabia, and supporting her parents and siblings back home.

We collected and distributed clothing and blankets. We published newsletters, held film screenings and two "Hope Sunday" events to raise awareness of Social Justice issues and needs.

In all of these efforts we enjoyed the unquestioning support of all parishioners and we formed strong friendships amongst ourselves.

We have recently held our final meeting. We are all 20 years older than we were when we began, and health issues and life events have impacted us all.

We take this opportunity to thank parishioners for their loyal support and to express the hope that our example will be taken up by others, and that our parish will continue to reach out to those who need help, as Jesus taught us to do.

We have a wealth of experience in how to stage and manage events, which we can pass on, so no one needs to start a group like ours from scratch. We urge parishioners to consider starting a new group. The work, no matter how small, is needed and rewarding.
