THE YEAR OF SAINT LUKE - BEING THE GOOD NEWS & PROMOTING GOD'S HOSPITALITY

This week's readings: Micah 5:1-4; Heb 10:5-10; Gospel Luke 1:39-44

GOSPEL REFLECTION BY GREG SUNTER: The gospel passages of the second and third weeks of Advent this year featured John the Baptist in his role of preparing the way for the coming of Jesus; the one who announces the arrival of the Christ. In this week's passage, which goes back to an earlier point in the gospel of Luke, we might say that the as yet unborn John is already recognising the presence of the Christ. When Mary goes to visit her cousin, Elizabeth, the child within Elizabeth's womb – John – leaps for joy. At the time of the Annunciation, when Mary was told by the angel Gabriel that she was to give birth to a child, Mary is also told that Elizabeth and Zechariah, although very old, were to also give birth to a child. Mary rushes to visit Elizabeth, not to make sure that the angel was telling her the truth but because the fact that Elizabeth was also pregnant was a sign of confirmation to Mary that she had indeed made the right decision. Elizabeth's unlikely pregnancy confirms for Mary the even greater truth of her own pregnancy. These two women, separated by age and distance, share a common experience of God acting in their lives to bring about unlikely events. The lives of their two children will be inextricably linked such that the one who leapt for joy in his mother's womb will eventually and announce the arrival of his ministry to the people other The joy expressed by Elizabeth and her child reflects the joy of all people of faith as we draw so close to the celebration of Christmas and the greatest expression of God's love – to enter into the world as one just like us and share our experience.

Gospel Focus – Blessed are you: Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Elizabeth's greeting to Mary forms the second portion of the traditional prayer, the Hail Mary. The first portion of the prayer also comes from Luke's gospel and is the greeting of the angel Gabriel to Mary at the Annunciation. The final portion was framed by the Church. Use of the Hail Mary dates to about the 11th Century. Scriptural context – John the Baptist: The gospel of Luke pays greater attention to John the Baptist than any of the other three gospels. In this gospel the foretelling of John's birth precedes the foretelling of the birth of Jesus and then the birth of John immediately precedes the birth of Jesus. In the gospel of Luke, John is the forerunner of Jesus. The story of his miraculous birth is paralleled with that of Jesus but always comes first. Luke makes it abundantly clear that John came first and prepared the way for the coming of Jesus.

Living the Gospel – Looking for signs: When Mary went to visit Elizabeth she was not looking for a sign that she had made the right decision. Rather, because she had accepted God's will the sign was given to her. Her acceptance and action came first. The sign came later as a confirmation. At times we look to God to provide us with a sign that our impending action is the right choice. However, faith acts in trust and confidence; it doesn't wait around for a green light from God. When we do act in faith, the flow-on effects are the sign of confirmation.

Dear Parishioners: I write to notify you that Mrs Jackie Purcell has accepted a new role in Catholic education. Her years here have certainly made our Parish School an outstanding educational community and we thank her for her considerable and significant contribution. Please be assured that the leadership structure that exists in our Parish School will continue to serve us all well as 2019 begins. Mr Ed Weekes has kindly accepted the role of Acting Principal for the foreseeable future. This will be a transition time for all of us. Ms Purcell takes up her new role on the 4 March 2019.

**Raise your voices** ... **Entrance antiphon:** Drop down dew from above, you heavens, and let the clouds rain down the Just One; let the earth be opened and bring forth a Saviour.

Response to the Psalm: Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved.

**Gospel acclamation:** Alleluia, alleluia! I am the servant of the Lord: may his will for me be done. Alleluia! **Communion antiphon:** Behold, a Virgin shall conceive and bear a son; and his name will be called Emmanuel.
