THE YEAR OF SAINT LUKE - BEING THE GOOD NEWS BY PROMOTING GOD'S HOSPITALITY

This week's readings: Gen 18:20-32; Col 2:12-14; Gospel Luke 11:1-13

GOSPEL REFLECTION BY GREG SUNTER: In today's gospel, Jesus provides his disciples, and all Christians, with a model for prayer. In keeping with this modelling by Jesus, it is significant that the Lord's Prayer, or Our Father, is the common prayer of all Christians, regardless of denomination.

The parable and teaching that follow the Lord's Prayer make clear the particular purpose of prayer that Jesus was highlighting – prayer as petition. In this instance, Jesus assures us that if we pray for what we need with conviction and confidence, then God cannot fail to respond to our prayer. Jesus in fact encourages us to be demanding and persistent in our prayer. However, the parable used to demonstrate the persistent nature of prayer is not focused on demands for selfish purposes, but rather the neighbour needs assistance in fulfilling his obligations of hospitality to a traveller. He is not waking his neighbour in the middle of the night to ask for bread for himself; he asks for bread to give to his guest. He asks for help to fulfil his duty and responsibility. This gives us something of an idea about how we might focus our prayer. Praying for a pony or new bike isn't quite in the same league!

The final element of the gospel passage provides us with a description of God's love and care by something of a negative comparison: if human parents would not do harm instead of good to their children, God is even less likely to act like this towards us. It's a bit of an odd way around of saying that God's love is greater than anything within our experience or imagination.

Living the Gospel – Ask, Search, Knock: Jesus says in the gospel, 'Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you.' The actions of asking, searching and knocking are means by which we initiate the encounter with God. If we don't ask, search and knock, how is anyone (including God) to know our needs or know what it is that we are searching for. Particularly in our spiritual lives, it is only through the search and the knocking on the doors of different experiences that we ever come closer to finding answers.

Historical Context – Stone for bread: The stone/bread, snake/fish and scorpion/egg comparisons seem a little far fetched to us, but would have made perfect sense to a 1st Century Palestinian audience. The flat, brown stones around Lake Galilee look very similar to the flat bread that was baked in the area. The 'snake' may refer to a sea-snake – an eel – which might be caught up in a fisherman's nets but was regarded as unclean by the Jews. The poisonous scorpions of the region are very pale in colour and when curled up at rest could be mistaken for an egg.

Gospel Focus – Relationship: A crucial aspect of prayer is the attitude with which we view God. We trust in God's character that it is not a pointless exercise to ask for something. We trust that God is even more loving than a parent who tries to give their child what they need. If we did not make these basic assumptions about God, there would be little point in prayer. When our prayer lives falter at times, perhaps we need to first check out our relationship with God and our attitude towards God before trying to 'fix' the ways we pray.

Raise your voices ...

Entrance Antiphon: God is in his holy place, God who unites those who dwell in his house; he himself gives might and strength to his people.

Response to the Psalm: Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! You have received the Spirit which makes us God's children, and in that Spirit we call God our Father. Alleluia!

Eucharistic Acclamation: We proclaim your Death, O Lord and profess your Resurrection until you come again.

Communion Antiphon: Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy. Blessed are the clean of heart, for they shall see God.



PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL MEMBERSHIP AND TASK

While the understanding of the functioning of a Parish Pastoral Council will continue to develop, a number of issues require careful attention.

- 1. Membership of the Parish Pastoral Council should be open to all parishioners, respecting the reality that each person is unique and has the potential to make a specific contribution. It is the community being served that has the primary task of choosing the members of the Council. While the processes used for this purpose will vary according to the local situation, the actual selection of members is the task of parishioners. When the membership is determined mainly by private invitation, there is very little possibility that the community will recognise and take ownership of the supposedly representative group.
- Ideally, the members of the Parish Pastoral Council are representative
 of the whole parish community. Each member aims to take a community view
 of issues and not an individual or group perspective. All parishioners are
 potential members.
- 3. In addition, the Parish Pastoral Council may include two or three exofficio members, who have been invited to participate because of their role in
 the community. For example, the Parish School Principal, or representative,
 is usually a member. In addition, included in this category may be a person
 from the Parish Finance Council and sometimes the Parish Manager or
 Parish Secretary.
- 4. Since each member is a representative of the whole parish community, there are a number of concerns if members are recruited solely on the basis of their current participation in specific parish groups or ministries. The concerns include:
- A rich resource of people remains untapped, while the people already involved are called upon to do even more. Consequently, those persons are excluded who consider that they could give time to the Pastoral Council, but not to another group as well.

- It is difficult to maintain an objective overall parish focus while representing a specific parish group.
- The amount of time and energy required of already busy parishioners often leads to frustration and burnout.
- The focus of the meetings tends to be limited to sustaining existing activities within the parish. The perspective of the wider mission of the Church may be overlooked.
- The Parish Pastoral Council does not have a life of its own because most of the meeting time will be used in reporting, reflecting on and reviewing the work of existing groups. The outcome is a rapid decrease in vigorous discussion and continuing vitality.
- 5. The Parish Pastoral Council is not simply one parish group among many others that make recommendations to the Pastor. Rather than focussing on a specific perspective, the Parish Pastoral Council operates from a broad overview, promoting a sharing of responsibility for the development of a more vital Christian community. Its underlying aim is to encourage and support all members of the community in their efforts to respond to their baptismal call to participate in the mission of the Church. This goes beyond the maintenance of existing services in the community.
- 6. The Parish Pastoral Council is not a management or an administrative body. As Parish Pastoral Council members usually meet only once a month for approximately two hours, it is impractical to expect that they can be responsible for everyday administrative detail. The daily issues of management and administration are the responsibility of the Pastor, with the assistance of the parish staff if people and financial resources are available. The staff may include at least one of the following: an Associate Pastor, a Parish Pastoral Minister, Office Manager, Parish Secretary and Volunteer Members.
