THE YEAR OF SAINT LUKE - BEING THE GOOD NEWS BY PROMOTING GOD'S HOSPITALITY

This week's readings: Eccl 1:2, 2:21-23; Col 3:1-5, 9-11; Gospel Luke 12:13-21

GOSPEL REFLECTION BY GREG SUNTER: One of the themes running through the gospels is that wealth can be an obstacle to entering fully into relationship with God. It is not wealth in itself that is problematic but rather valuing material riches above everything else and the constant desire to accumulate more and more. We have the story of the rich young man who asks Jesus what he must do to inherit the kingdom and Jesus tells him to sell everything he has and give away the proceeds. The young man goes away sad because he thought that with his great accumulation of wealth he'd be able to buy anything that he needed to gain the kingdom. We also have the saying of Jesus that it is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than a rich man to enter the kingdom of God. The parable in today's gospel depicts a man who has so much grain that he decides to build bigger barns to store it all. The parable follows Jesus' teaching that 'a man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than he needs.' The point is about having more than we need. What good is served by one person having more than they need while others do not have enough to meet their needs? The rich man who had the abundant harvest could have stored up all that he needed and still been able to share the abundance with others. Liberation theology introduced the catch phrase, 'live simply so that others may simply live'. The call was for those in wealthier countries to simplify their wasteful and indulgent lifestyles so that others may be able to meet their most basic of needs.

Scriptural context – Do not worry: This parable and teaching about the love of wealth is followed up by Jesus telling his disciples not to worry about what they will eat and what they will wear. He invites them to look to the birds of the air and flowers of the fields. God provides them with all that they need. Jesus tells his disciples to seek the kingdom, and all the other necessities of life will be given to them as well. Rather than focusing on accumulating wealth as the rich man in today's parable, Jesus reassures his disciples that if they focus their lives on the kingdom they will have all that they need.

Have you thought? – Greed is good! In the 1987 movie, *Wall Street*, the corporate raider, Gordon Gekko, famously declares: 'Greed is good! Greed is right! Greed works! ... Greed – for life, for money, for love, knowledge – has marked the upward surge of mankind!' Whilst the depiction was intended to parody and critique corporate behaviour of the 1980s, in many ways it came to define it instead. In the intervening decades, little has changed. The pursuit of more and more wealth and the ludicrous sums paid to corporate CEOs are exactly the imagery Jesus would use today for his parable.

Living the Gospel – This hoard of yours... Our modern society is particularly dominated by a mindset of accumulating more than we might ever need. The saying 'Whoever has the most toys, wins' holds more than just a shred of truth for many people. Our consumerist lifestyle nurtures the desire to accumulate more and more 'stuff'. Every time we turn on the television there is a new 'must have' gadget. We talk about built-in obsolescence of manufactured goods and every new technological device makes older models redundant so that we feel we constantly have to upgrade. How would we answer God's question, 'so this hoard of yours, whose will it be then?'

**Raise your voices** ... **Entrance Antiphon:** O God, come to my assistance; O Lord, make haste to help me! You are my rescuer, my help; O Lord, do not delay.

Response to the Psalm: In every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Happy the poor in spirit; the kingdom of heaven is theirs. Alleluia!

**Eucharistic Acclamation**: When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again.



## Other ways of Pastoral Planning

- 'Appreciative Inquiry' is a methodology that searches for the best practices already present in a parish where is there energy and life in the parish? Why is this so? Once this is identified, the parish focuses on developing further what it does best and seeks ways to apply that energy throughout the life of the parish.
- A methodology related to this sees a shift from 'needs based' planning to 'gifts based' planning. Instead of focusing on the needs of the parish and how they can be met, the council works at unleashing people's gifts in the service of the kingdom, confident that the variety and fullness of gifts in the parish are more than enough to deal with the parish's issues. Important needs will still be named and planned for, but in the context of 'a thousand flowers blooming' rather than strict adherence to a master plan for all. By focusing on the gifts rather than the needs the parish may come to see itself as a gifted parish rather than a needy parish.

# Pastoral Planning and Pope John Paul II

In his letter Novo Millennio Ineunte, Pope John Paul II places "pastoral planning under the heading of holiness [which] is a choice filled with consequences. "(31) He has much more advice about pastoral planning including "If we have truly contemplated the face of Christ, dear Brothers and Sisters, our pastoral planning will necessarily be inspired by the 'new commandment' which he gave us: 'Love one



### Pastoral Planning

Parish Pastoral Councils undertake pastoral planning for their parish.

Pastoral Planning differs from many other forms of planning because the principles that shape it and the goals it aims towards are clearly based on the gospel.

While in many forms of planning the principles of efficiency, economy and determination are highly prized, this is not always so with pastoral

planning. In pastoral planning the path taken to reach the goal is as important as the goal itself, sometimes more



## Spirituality of Communion

To understand the processes of pastoral planning it helps to understand that pastoral planning in these times grows out of a spirituality of communion.

Through this spirituality we understand that all of us in the parish are in communion with Christ, and through Christ in communion with one another.

Together we make up the body of Christ, and what touches one of us touches all of us.

We each have different gifts, roles and functions within the body of Christ and this is part of our strength.

We believe that each person in this communion

is loved fully by God, and so - in Christ - we truly love each other as brothers and sisters.

We value the contribution of each person and are grateful for their commitment to the parish.

## Pastoral Planning Processes

The main processes of pastoral planning are:

Communication - if we are all part of the body of Christ then communication that is clear and timely needs to be part of the parish culture and exercised at all levels. A culture of secrecy will often cripple community and shatter communion.


Consultation - because the Holy Spirit moves in the lives of all God's people, it is necessary to consult meaningfully during the planning process; the purpose of this is to guide leadership towards a more effective decision than it would otherwise have made.

Collaboration - means to work together, and is quite different to delegation. It speaks of partnership and shared commitment, trust and being able

to rely on one

another.



## How to do Pastoral Planning

There are different methods of pastoral planning and a widely used one has these five simple steps which are taken over a period of some time:

I. Lead the parish to articulate its vision for itself. This takes time and discussion, and is quite different to getting the parish to accept someone else's

vision. The key question is 'What is God calling this parish community to be?' (not 'What is God calling this parish to do?' - that comes later). The



very short and easily remembered by all parishioners.

- 2. Honestly name the current reality of the parish not just the negatives, not just the positives perhaps create a parish profile.
- 3. Allow time for some critical analysis together e.g. discuss 'Why is the parish the way it is and not as we believe it is called to be?'
- 4. Plan 'What practical and achievable goals will help the parish move from its current reality towards its vision? Who has to do what and by when to achieve these goals?'
- 5. Pray together often as a parish for what we're doing and trying to achieve, and evaluate how it's going at set intervals.

"Pastoral planning is the action of the church organising itself for mission."
