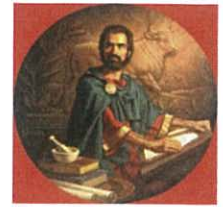

THE YEAR OF SAINT LUKE – BEING THE GOOD NEWS BY PROMOTING GOD'S HOSPITALITY

This week's readings: 2 Tim 4:10 – 17; 2 Tim 3:14 – 4:2; Gospel Luke 10:1 – 9

PATRONAL REFLECTION

Our focus for 2019 as it is the Year of Luke – Be the Good News by promoting God's Hospitality

Luke portrays the life and ministry of Jesus as a "divine visitation" to the world, seeking hospitality. The One who comes as visitor and guest becomes host and offers a hospitality in which the entire world can become truly human, be at home, and know salvation in the depths of their hearts. The Hospitality of God approaches Luke's Gospel through the interpretive key of "hospitality." It looks at the Gospel as a whole, yet lingers upon scenes where the theme of "hospitality" is particularly prominent, such as the infancy stories, Jesus at Nazareth, Jesus in the house of Simon, the Good Samaritan, Martha and Mary, the banquet in 14:1-35, the Prodigal Son, Jesus' visit to the tax collector Zacchaeus, the institution of the Eucharist, and the Emmaus event. Fr Brendan Byrne SJ, in his book "The Hospitality of God", stresses that those in Luke's Gospel who readily offer hospitality - chiefly the marginalized and the poor - find themselves drawn into a much deeper sphere of hospitality, the hospitality of God. Those who have difficulty sharing are challenged by Jesus to conversion so that they, too, may not be left out of the banquet of life to which God calls all human beings. Luke's Gospel, ever interested in the process of human transformation, explores this resistance to God's gift and the ways in which individuals need to be converted if they are to come to "knowledge of salvation." Luke's Gospel is written out of faith in the risen Lord. Its primary intent is to bring people of all subsequent Christian generations into saving encounter with the Lord who was raised from the dead and lives among us in the power of the Spirit. Reading and hearing the Gospel in faith allows individuals and communities to access the hospitality of God brought by Jesus.

Our Parish Discernment Gathering to prepare to recommission our Parish Pastoral Council or Parish Stewardship Committee was held last Sunday afternoon in our Parish Hall. Thankyou to all the Parishioners who attended. We worked together during that time to come to a deeper awareness of the importance of this initiative for all Parishioners and the Parish in general, the local Church; finding our personal & communal faith voice to be the Good News in the cacophony of conflicting conversations these days, while at the same time promoting God's hospitality.

Darren Mclean, current chair, welcomed us and provided the context for our gathering. **Fr Gerard** led us in an extended Prayer exercise to ask God to connect with us, personally and communally, so that we were better equipped to know how to proceed. **Mike Yore** offered an in-depth analysis of the 'why's and wherefores' of Parish Pastoral Councils today, built on the wisdom of the Second Vatican Council. **Margaret Gearon** outlined the Parish Pastoral Council Guidelines for a community living the Good News through hospitality and outreach.

This weekend we celebrate our Patronal Feast as a way of coming together as a Parish Community: to acknowledge our diversity (Our Parish's Plenary Council 2020 reply) our strengths, what we do well (Lent 20 19), what else can we do & what we can do better (Pentecost 2019), who is prepared to do it (current discernment — what service are you being asked to give to this Community) and what we want to do together, to get us to where we want to go ... (OUR Parish Pastoral Plan)

Raise your voices ... Entrance Antiphon: How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of the one who brings glad tidings of peace, bearing good news, announcing salvation!

Response to the Psalm: Your friends tell the glory of your kingship, Lord.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! I have chosen you from the world, says the Lord; to go and bear fruit that will last. Alleluia!

Eucharistic Acclamation: When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again.

Communion Antiphon: The Lord sent out disciples to proclaim throughout the towns: The kingdom of God is at hand for you.

YEAR 12 PARISHIONERS finished school this week and now get ready for their exams. The work they have done this year and preceding years will hopefully provide them with the confidence to sit their Year 12 exams and be ready for whatever comes next in their young lives. We'll all be praying that you'll continue to do your best.

A DEFINITION OF DISCERNMENT: Christian spiritual discernment can be separated from other types of discernment because every decision is to be made in accordance with God's will. The fundamental definition for Christian discernment is a decision making process in which an individual makes a discovery that can lead to future action. In the process of Christian spiritual discernment God guides the individual to help them arrive at the best decision. The way to arrive at the best decision in Christian spiritual discernment is to seek out internal and external signs of God's action and then apply them to the decision at hand. Christian Discernment also has an emphasis on Jesus, and making decisions that align with those of Jesus within the New Testament. The focus on God and Jesus when making decisions is what separates Christian discernment from secular discernment. *St. Ignatius of Loyola is often regarded as the master of the discernment of spirits. Ignatian discernment comes from Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1556) when he created his own unique way of Catholic discernment. Ignatian discernment uses a series of Spiritual Exercises for discerning life choices and focuses on noticing God in all aspects of life. The Spiritual Exercises are designed to help people & communities who are facing a major life decision. There are seven steps of discernment to be followed that include identifying the issue, taking time to pray about the choice, making a wholehearted decision, discussing the choice with a mentor and then finally trusting the decision made. While Ignatius was a religious man his discernment process can be applied to anyone independent of religion. This practice has been around a looong time ...*

A VOCATION VIEW: Pray persistently and God will respond. Ask God to bless the Church with faith-filled ministers. (Luke 18:1-8)

STEWARDSHIP CORNER: "...proclaim the word, be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient..." (2 Timothy 4:2) It is not always convenient to be a good steward, especially when all the temptations of our busy and materialistic world get in the way. Now add our own pride and ego into the equation and living a stewardship lifestyle may be downright uncomfortable! Remember, God didn't call us to be comfortable. He called us to be faithful.

WHAT IS THE EXTRAORDINARY MISSIONARY MONTH? In 2019, to celebrate the 100th anniversary of Pope Benedict XV's Apostolic Letter *Maximum Illud*, Pope Francis announced that October will be an Extraordinary Missionary Month. He encourages us to live out joyfully our responsibility for the world. To honour the extraordinary nature of this celebration, **Catholic Mission** has planned some events to engage as wide an audience as possible. **The Theme:** For the Extraordinary Missionary Month, the Holy Father has chosen the theme **'Baptized and Sent: The Church of Christ on a Mission in the World'**. Awakening the awareness of the *missio ad gentes*, and reinvigorating the responsibility of proclaiming the Gospel with new enthusiasm, are themes that combine the pastoral concern of Pope Benedict XV in *Maximum Illud* with the missionary vitality expressed by Pope Francis in the Apostolic Exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium*: "Missionary action is the paradigm of every work of the Church" (EG 15). **How to Live Your Own Extraordinary Missionary Month:** There are four dimensions, specified by the Pope, to live more intensely the journey of preparation for the Extraordinary Missionary Month October 2019: **1.** A personal encounter with Jesus Christ living in His Church through the Eucharist, the Word of God, personal and communal prayer; **2.** Testimony: missionary saints, martyrs and confessors of the faith, as an expression of the Church scattered throughout the world; **3.** Missionary formation: biblical, catechetical, spiritual and theological; **4.** Missionary charity. SAINTS FUN FACTS

St. Luke was born in Syria and trained as a physician. He was also one of the most extensive writers of the New Testament. In addition to his gospels, he also wrote the 'Acts of the Apostles.'

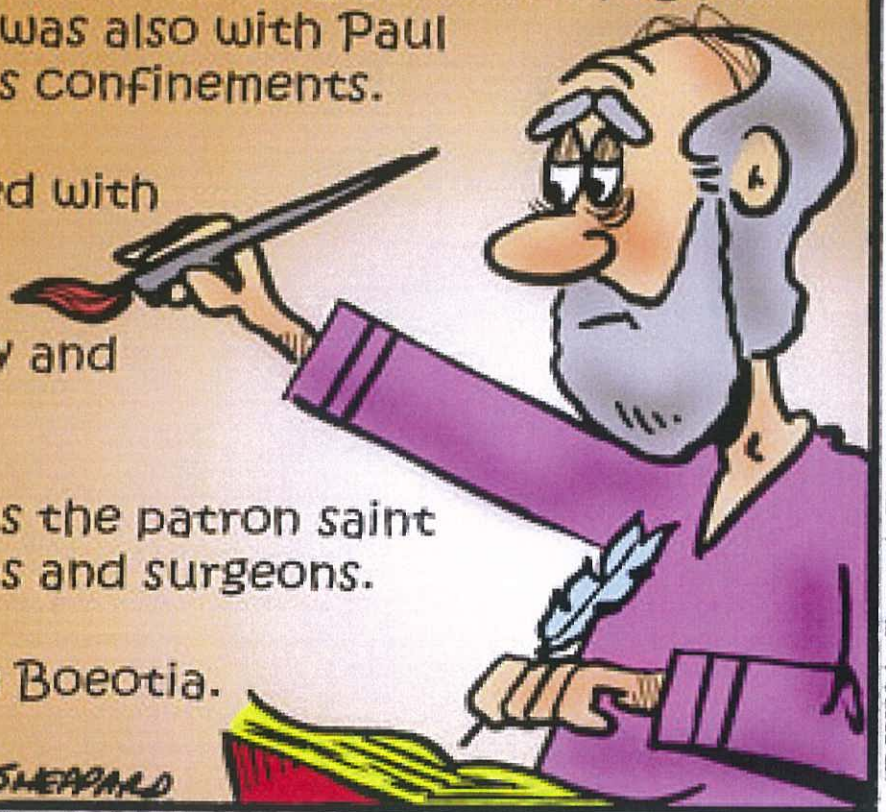
He was one of 'the seventy' and worked with St. Paul, traveling to Rome and converting Jews and pagans to Christianity. He was also with Paul during several of his confinements.

Luke is also credited with being a prolific painter, creating many works of Mary and Jesus.

St. Luke is known as the patron saint of artists, physicians and surgeons.

He died at age 84 in Boeotia.

PATRONAL REFLECTION CONTINUED ...

Luke's unique perspective on Jesus can be seen in the six miracles and eighteen parables not found in the other gospels. Luke's is the gospel of the poor and of social justice. He is the one who tells the story of **Lazarus and the Rich Man** who ignored him. Luke is the one who uses "**Blessed are the poor**" instead of "Blessed are the poor in spirit" in the beatitudes. **Only in Luke's gospel do we hear Mary's Magnificat** where she proclaims that God "has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty" (Luke 1:52-53).

Luke also has a special connection with the women in Jesus' life, especially Mary. It is only in Luke's gospel that we hear the story of the **Annunciation**, **Mary's visit to Elizabeth** including the Magnificat, the Presentation, and the story of Jesus' disappearance in Jerusalem. **It is Luke that we have to thank for the Scriptural parts of the Hail Mary:** "Hail Mary full of grace" spoken at the Annunciation and "Blessed are you and blessed is the fruit of your womb Jesus" spoken by her cousin Elizabeth.

Forgiveness and God's mercy to sinners is also of first importance to Luke. **Only in Luke do we hear the story of the Prodigal Son** welcomed back by the overjoyed father. **Only in Luke do we hear the story of the forgiven woman** disrupting the feast by washing Jesus' feet with her tears. **Throughout Luke's gospel, Jesus takes the side of the sinner** who wants to return to God's mercy.
