Another Missing 'R'

Last Monday Pope Francis returned to Rome after a historic visit to Iraq. He is the first Pope ever to visit the 'cradle of civilisation' the country known as the 'land of Abraham.' Tradition has it that Abraham was born in the town of Ur, an area in modern day Iraq. During his return flight to Italy Pope Francis gave another of his impromptu press conferences at which he said that many people were very worried about him going to Iraq, because of the safety and COVID but he responded by saying that he felt it was a risk he had to take.

From a young age, our parents tell us to 'not take silly risks' and that is good advice. These days 'risk management' is an important part of everyday life in business, hospitality, event planning and so on. This is wise as it's about due and proper care for one another.

I wonder though, have we ever thought of taking a risk for the Gospel? This is what Francis was doing as he came as an outsider purely as a person of peace and of respect for all faiths. He said to Grand Avatollah Ali Al-Sistani, one of the most revered clerics in Shia Islam, "You are human, you are a child of God and you are my brother." The Grand Ayatollah never stands up for anybody, but he stood up twice when he and Francis were meeting. Indeed both men were taking a risk.

The Christian story is littered with people who have taken risks, Mary MacKillop, Oscar Romero, Mother Theresa, Martin Luther King, Edmund Rice, Maria Goretti to name but a few. Each of them risked something, whether it was safety, position, ridicule for the sake of the Gospel.

At the core of our Lenten challenge is the command to live the Gospel, the Good News. It might be risky at times, so are we prepared for that?

1st Reading—2 Chronicles 36:14-16 19-23

All the heads of the priesthood, and the people too, added infidelity to infidelity, copying all the shameful practices of the nations and defiling the Temple that the Lord had consecrated for himself in Jerusalem. The Lord, the God of their ancestors, tirelessly sent them messenger after messenger, since he wished to spare his people and his house. But they ridiculed the messengers of God, they despised his words, they laughed at his prophets, until at last the wrath of the Lord rose so high against his people that there was no further remedy.

Their enemies burned down the Temple of the God, demolished the walls of Jerusalem, set fire to all its palaces, and destroyed everything of value in it. The survivors were deported by Nebuchadnezzar to Babylon; they were to serve him and his sons until the kingdom of Persia came to power. This is how the word of the Lord was fulfilled that he spoke through Jeremiah, 'Until this land has enjoyed its Sabbath rest, until seventy years have gone by, it will keep sabbath throughout the days of its desolation.' And in the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, to fulfil the word of the Lord that was spoken through Jeremiah, the Lord roused the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia to issue a proclamation and to have it publicly displayed throught his kngdom: 'Thus speaks Cyrus king of Persia, "The Lord, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth' he has ordered me to build him a Temple in Jerusalem, in Judah. Whoever there is among you of all his people, may his God be with him! Let him go up."'

2nd Reading—Ephesians 2:4-10

God loved us with so much love that he was generous with his mercy: when we were dead through our sins, he brought us to life with Christ—it is through grace that you have been saved—and raised us up with him and gave us a place with him in heaven, in Christ Jesus.

This was to show for all ages to come, through his goodness towards us in Christ Jesus, how infinitely rich he is in grace. Because it is by grace that you have been saved, through faith; not by anything of your own, but by a gift from God; not by anything that you have done, so that nobody can claim the credit. We are God's work of art, created in Christ Jesus to live the good life as from the beginning he had meant us to live it.

Gospel—John 3:14-21

Jesus said to Nicodemus:

'The Son of Man must be lifted up as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him. Yes, God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life. For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved. No one who believes in him will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already, because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son.

On these grounds is sentence pronounced: that though the light has come into the world men have shown they prefer darkness to the light because their deeds were evil. And indeed, everybody who does wrong hates the light and avoids it, for fear his actions should not be exposed; but the man who lives by the truth comes out into the light, so that it may be plainly seen that what he does is done in God.'



Arsad, an Indonesian farmer, had no toilet so he and his family always had to walk into the forest to an open defecation area. His family was often sick



and open defecation caused many neighbourhood disputes. With the support of Caritas Australia and its partner, Laz Harfa, Arsad took part in hygiene, sanitation and financial management training. He then funded the building of a toilet in his house and helped other community members to save for toilets. Now Arsad's family is healthier. Their community no longer practices open defecation and is more harmonious. Arsad inspired his community to 'Be More'.
