God's Presence Amid our Soul's Despair By Fr Samuel Pearson

"We have therefore made the assessment that COVID-19 can be characterized as a pandemic." Those words by World Health Organisation Director-General Dr Tedros Ghebreyesus, seem a world away and yet so much has happened since he uttered them. Life, as we knew it, rapidly began to change. At first, the changes were hard to believe. Many scoffed at the implications of the new buzzword "social distancing". Now, however, not so much. The word has become as common as the morning takeaway coffee is for many commuters, in (now emptier) trains, office blocks and city streets. But now things were different, or so I thought. I had three vaccines, life after a couple of years of upheaval seemed relatively normal and COVID didn't seem so bad... apparently. However, recently, my complacency about things was rudely interrupted (well, actually, it was shaken to its core, uprooted and violently thrown about, before being plunged back into the soil!). I got COVID. Really bad. In what seemed a moment, my calendar went from full, to empty, while my throat and nose went from empty, to full. Though at home with family, I found myself alone, in my bed, too tired to say or do anything.

Illness does this to us. In different ways, we all have experienced its disruptive effects in our lives and some of us are experiencing this now. What's more, this painful disruption is not limited to our physical lives, but also impacts upon the spiritual. Perhaps you've heard the phrase "Dark Night of the Soul"? It comes from the thought and poetry of the Spaniard, John of the Cross, one of the great saints in the church and a sure guide in navigating the dynamics of the spiritual life. For St John, we live amidst a good and beautiful world, but we are meant finally for union with God. Therefore, the soul must become free from its attachments to finite things (however good in themselves), to be free for friendship with God. This purification involves, first, what John called "the night of the senses," that is to say, the letting go of physical and sensual pleasures, and it continues with the "night of the soul," which is a detachment from the thoughts, ideas, and mental images that one can use as a substitute for God. Like all purifications, this can be painful, especially if one's attachment to these finite things is particularly acute. It will often be experienced, he said, as dryness in prayer and a keen sense of the absence of God, even of God's active abandonment. In this process, God has not 'left the building'; rather, he is performing a kind of surgery upon our soul, cutting away unhelpful attachments, so that life might intensify. Whatever life throws at us, we can always take courage not only in the lives of 'our neighbour', especially the saints, but in God, despite his seeming absence. As our First Reading assures us today, the Law God gives to us "is not beyond your strength or beyond your reach. It is not in heaven...nor beyond the seas...No, [it] is very near to you, it is in your mouth and in your heart for your observance." That Word is Jesus himself. He is with us even when we feel that we hang alone upon life's crosses. Animated by that faith, may we bring the 'light of Christ', to the 'dark souls' that the world's present ills foster around us.

First Reading: Dt 30:10-14

Moses said to the people: 'Obey the voice of the Lord your God, keeping those commandments and laws of his that are written in the Book of this Law, and you shall return to the Lord your God with all your heart and soul.

'For this Law that I enjoin on you today is not beyond your strength or beyond your reach. It is not in heaven, so that you need to wonder, "Who will go up to heaven for us and bring it down to us, so that we may hear it and keep it?" Nor is it beyond the seas, so that you need to wonder, "Who will cross the seas for us and bring it back to us, so that we may hear it and keep it?" No, the Word is very near to you, it is in your mouth and in your heart for your observance.'

Second Reading: Col 1:15-20

Christ Jesus is the image of the unseen God and the first-born of all creation. for in him were created all things in heaven and on earth: everything visible and everything invisible, Thrones, Dominations, Sovereignties, Powers all things were created through him and for him. Before anything was created, he existed, and he holds all things in unity. Now the Church is his body, he is its head. As he is the Beginning, he was first to be born from the dead, so that he should be first in every way; because God wanted all perfection to be found in him and all things to be reconciled through him and for him, everything in heaven and everything on earth, when he made peace by his death on the cross.

Gospel: Lk 10:25-37

There was a lawyer who, to disconcert Jesus, stood up and said to him, 'Master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' He said to him, 'What is written in the Law? What do you read there?' He replied, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbour as yourself.' 'You have answered right,' said Jesus, 'do this and life is yours.'

But the man was anxious to justify himself and said to Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?' Jesus replied, 'A man was once on his way down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of brigands; they took all he had, beat him and then made off, leaving him half dead. Now a priest happened to be travelling down the same road, but when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. In the same way a Levite who came to the place saw him, and passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan traveller who came upon him was moved with compassion when he saw him. He went up and bandaged his wounds, pouring oil and wine on them. He then lifted him on to his own mount, carried him to the inn and looked after him. Next day, he took out two denarii and handed them to the innkeeper. "Look after him," he said, "and on my way back I will make good any extra expense you have." Which of these three, do you think, proved himself a neighbour to the man who fell into the brigands' hands?' 'The one who took pity on him,' he replied. Jesus said to him, 'Go and do the same yourself.'
