It is just over a week now since the death of Prince Philip was announced and his funeral is this weekend. Tributes have flowed since the announcement of his passing and many hours of television coverage have been given to his extraordinary life. We all know the stories of his 'gaffes' and often blunt and at times insensitive comments, but the thing that has come through the most in what I have seen and read is what can be summarised as his 'life of service.' Even some of our most cynical commentators in the media, both on radio and in print have acknowledged this life of unselfish dedicated and committed service. In so many ways it seems to me that Prince Philip was a person who wanted a better world for so many, especially the young with his great work with the Duke of Edinburgh Awards. He was a person deeply committed to the care of the environment and to nature. Perhaps the reason he has captured so much comment in this past week is that he was really so different. He stood out as a person of unselfish service in a world too tainted with too many living lives that are selfish, self-seeking, self-serving, self-interested. And the trouble is these are the folk that all too often are the ones in position of power and influence in so many walks of life like politics and big business, and the finance sector. I wonder if in fact Prince Philip indeed has shown us all that there is another and better way to live. Just a thought.

1st Reading—Acts of the Apostles 3:13-15 17-19

Peter said to the people: 'You are Israelites, and it is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, who has glorified his servant Jesus, the same Jesus you handed over and then disowned in the presence of Pilate, after Pilate had decided to release him. It was you who accused the Holy One, the Just One, you who demanded the reprieve of a murderer while you killed the prince of life. God, however, raised him from the dead, and to that fact we are the witnesses.

'Now I know, brothers, that neither you nor your leaders had any idea what you were really doing; this was the way God carried out what he had foretold, when he said through all his prophets that his Christ would suffer. Now you must repent and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out.'

2nd Reading—1 John 2:1-5

I am writing this, my children, to stop you sinning; but if anyone should sin, we have our advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ, who is just; he is the sacrifice that takes our sins away, and not only ours, but the whole world's. We can be sure that we know God only by keeping his commandments. Anyone who says, 'I know him', and does not keep his commandments, is a liar, refusing to admit the truth. But when anyone does obey what he has said, God's love comes to perfection in him.

Gospel— Luke 24:35-48

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread.

They were still talking about all this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great they at they could not believe it, and they stood dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms, has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'

REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

Easter is the season of mystagogical catechesis, that instruction that unpacks the hidden mystery of the experience of the sacraments of initiation received or renewed at Easter. The readings of each Sunday concentrate on some aspect of this mystery. The central theme of this Sunday is newness of life in Christ. This newness is not without its historical context. It burst forth first in the resurrection of Christ, and then through the preaching of the first Christians.

The readings testify that if we die with Christ, we will appear with him in glory; if we cast out the old yeast, we will be fresh dough. And when this wondrous transformation takes place, everything is new; everything is fresh. To what newness are we called? To what must we die in order to rise transformed? What old yeast of corruption must be cast out in order that we might be fresh dough? At Easter we renew our baptismal vows. What is it that we really renounce? Ours is a world of violence, of prejudice, of indifference. Too often we harbour feelings of anger and resentment, of selfishness and disdain. Easter proclaims that Christ has died and has risen; with him we die to all of the wickedness in our lives and in our world, and we set our hearts on higher things, on sincerity and on truth.

An extra little job!

Archbishop Peter has appointed me as Episcopal Vicar for Catholic Schools. And what does that mean, I hear you ask! A good question. We have never had an EV for Catholic Schools before, so in a sense I'm building the plane I'm flying, but the appointment will focus on fostering and enhancing relationships between priests and principals, especially around faith leadership within schools. I will also work with relevant people to help build the opportunities for school staffs to enhance their abilities as teachers of religious education and support the opportunities for the faith formation of school staffs.

I think it will mean that I'll have to cut back on some of my other areas of responsibilities with the Priests Remuneration Fund, but not the Retirement Foundation. Hopefully much of the new work can be done from here but obviously there will be times when I'll need to be at the Office of Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools and on site at schools beyond here from time to time. Catholic Education has been a significant part of my ministry as a priest so whilst much of this will be new I think I've got the background to take it on. We'll see how it goes! Mark


