I'm sure many of us can remember Pope Francis appearing on the balcony above the entry to St Peter's Basilica the night he was elected. After the cheering subsided his first words to the crowds below and the world watching on TV were, "Brothers and sisters, bounasera," (good evening) and he simply referred to himself as the Bishop of Rome, not the Pope. Clearly the world was looking at the dawning of a new papacy. And countless photos of Francis and his exchanges with people since that night in March 2013 have provided so much evidence of that.

Only weeks after his election he celebrated Holy Thursday not in St Peter's, or the Church of the Bishop of Rome, the Lateran Basilica, but in a prison where he washed and kissed the feet of prisoners. Since then at subsequent celebrations of Holy Thursday he has washed the feet of Muslims, women and refugees. Only four months after his election he visited the island of Lampedusa, near where thousands of refugees and asylum seekers had drowned as they had attempted to reach Italy from Northern Africa. He went out into the Mediterranean Sea to throw a wreath and then at the Mass back on the island in his homily he said, "Immigrants dying at sea, in boats which were vehicles of hope and became vehicles of death.....When I first heard of this tragedy a few weeks ago, and realised it happens all too frequently, it has constantly come back to me like a painful thorn in my heart. So I felt that I had to come here today, to pray and to offer a sign of my closeness, but also to challenge our consciences lest this tragedy be repeated."

And this past week, perhaps the most powerful photo of his pontificate. Taken at the Cree Nation cemetery in Maskwacis, Canada there is the lone Pope, sitting in a wheelchair in front of white crosses, and there he blesses himself after he had buried his head in a prayer of sorrow. For he had just made an historic apology to the survivors of abuse suffered at the hands of Catholic educators in residential schools that the Church had operated for more than a century. There, he asked for forgiveness, not once, but three times. Mercy and compassion have been the hallmarks of his papacy. So often he stresses that these things, above all else, should be the hallmarks of the Church. We can lament that too often they aren't, and we should, but just as importantly we can commit to ensuring that more often they are.

Serve the Lord with Joy

First Reading: Ecc 1:2 2:21-23

Vanity of vanities, the Preacher says. Vanity of vanities. All is vanity!

For so it is that a man who has laboured wisely, skilfully and successfully must leave what is his own to someone who has not toiled for it at all. This, too, is vanity and great injustice; for what does he gain for all the toil and strain that he has undergone under the sun? What of all his laborious days, his cares of office, his restless nights? This, too, is vanity.

Second Reading: Col 3:1-5 9-11

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed – and he is your life – you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

That is why you must kill everything in you that belongs only to earthly life: fornication, impurity, guilty passion, evil desires and especially greed, which is the same thing as worshipping a false god; and never tell each other lies. You have stripped off your old behaviour with your old self, and you have put on a new self which will progress towards true knowledge the more it is renewed in the image of its creator; and in that image there is no room for distinction between Greek and Jew, between the circumcised or the uncircumcised, or between barbarian and Scythian, slave and free man. There is only Christ: he is everything and he is in everything.

Gospel: Lk 12:13-21

A man in the crowd said to Jesus, 'Master, tell my brother to give me a share of our inheritance.' 'My friend,' he replied, 'who appointed me your judge, or the arbitrator of your claims?' Then he said to them, 'Watch, and be on your guard against avarice of any kind, for a man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than he needs.'

Then he told them a parable: 'There was once a rich man who, having had a good harvest from his land, thought to himself, "What am I to do? I have not enough room to store my crops." Then he said, "This is what I will do; I will pull down my barns and build bigger ones, and store all my grain and my goods in them, and I will say to my soul: My soul, you have plenty of good things laid by for many years to come; take things easy, eat, drink, have a good time." But God said to him, "Fool! This very night the demand will be made for your soul; and this hoard of yours, whose will it be then?" So it is when a man stores up treasure for himself in place of making himself rich in the sight of God.'
