#### Within the Word—Happy New Year!

No, it's not January 1 yet, but that's not the only "New Year's Day" in our multicultural world. A new year begins on various days on the Jewish, Muslim, Hindu, Chinese, Mayan, and so many other calendars. So it should not seem strange that the Christian New Year begins four Sundays before Christmas, which this year is already on November 27 (technically, at sunset that Saturday).

Ours is not the kind of "new year" celebrated by secular culture on January 1—full of festivity and good cheer, not to mention resolutions, alcohol, and fireworks! The tone of the Christian New Year and the Advent season is more akin to Rosh Hashanah, the Jewish New Year, which begins a time for evaluating one's life before God that concludes on Yom Kippur, the day of atonement and repentance.

While our Advent season is not primarily penitential, it does include some wake-up calls! The Advent Scriptures challenge us to keep in mind that life on earth is not endless or perfect. The Lectionary readings call us to take an honest look at our lives and at our world and yet to continue living in joyful hope. Our beautiful rituals, like lighting the candles of our Advent wreath, gently remind us that we have reason to see, foster, and increase the hope-filled light that shines in the darkness. They also help us to long for the coming of Jesus, who is the true light of the world.

The word "Advent" comes from Latine *adveniens*, which means "coming" or "arrival." In ancient times it usually referred to the anticipated arrival of an emperor, king, or other important person, for which one had to prepare carefully. Our Christian New Year also begins with anticipation: someone important is coming for whom we must prepare! Although many think Advent is primarily the season for preparing to celebrate the birth of Jesus at Christmas, it is also a time for us to prepare for the "Parousia," our Lord's promised return in glory at the end of time.

The Advent Scriptures speak about the various "comings" of our Lord in the past and future, but also in the present. At the beginning of Advent, Isaiah and other prophets call us to prepare for the (future) coming of the Day of the Lord. Near the end of Advent, the readings focus on the biblical events that happened just before the birth of Jesus. But in the middle of Advent, we hear the preaching of John the Baptist, the "forerunner" or "precursor" who prepared people of his time for the coming of the Lord. Meditating on the Baptist's words—calling the people to repent and to recognize the "one who is mightier"—is also a good way of preparing ourselves for his coming to us here and now. There's no need to wait until the end of our lives, or the end of time, to be alert to God's desire to come to us in the present. Advent can help us invite Jesus to come into our midst each and every day of our lives. Or, as the early Christians said, "Maranatha, Come Lord Jesus!"

## Serve the Lord with Joy

### First Reading: Is 2:1-5

The vision of Isaiah son of Amoz, concerning Judah and Jerusalem.

In the days to come  
the mountain of the Temple of the Lord  
shall tower above the mountains  
and be lifted higher than the hills.  
All the nations will stream to it,  
peoples without number will come to it; and they will say:

‘Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord,  
to the Temple of the God of Jacob  
that he may teach us his ways  
so that we may walk in his paths;  
since the Law will go out from Zion,  
and the oracle of the Lord from Jerusalem.’

He will wield authority over the nations  
and adjudicate between many peoples;  
these will hammer their swords into ploughshares,  
their spears into sickles.  
Nation will not lift sword against nation,  
there will be no more training for war.  
O House of Jacob, come,  
let us walk in the light of the Lord.

### Second Reading: Rom 13:11-14

You know ‘the time’ has come: you must wake up now: our salvation is even nearer than it was when we were converted. The night is almost over, it will be daylight soon – let us give up all the things we prefer to do under the cover of the dark; let us arm ourselves and appear in the light. Let us live decently as people do in the daytime: no drunken orgies, no promiscuity or licentiousness, and no wrangling or jealousy. Let your armour be the Lord Jesus Christ.

### Gospel: Mt 24:37-44

Jesus said to his disciples: ‘As it was in Noah’s day, so will it be when the Son of Man comes. For in those days before the Flood people were eating, drinking, taking wives, taking husbands, right up to the day Noah went into the ark, and they suspected nothing till the Flood came and swept all away. It will be like this when the Son of Man comes. Then of two men in the fields one is taken, one left; of two women at the millstone grinding, one is taken, one left.

‘So stay awake, because you do not know the day when your master is coming. You may be quite sure of this that if the householder had known at what time of the night the burglar would come, he would have stayed awake and would not have allowed anyone to break through the wall of his house. Therefore, you too must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.’
