## Serve the Lord with Joy

### 1<sup>st</sup> Reading – Exodus 34:4-6. 8-9

With the two tablets of stone in his hands, Moses went up the mountain of Sinai in the early morning as the Lord had commanded him. And the Lord descended in the form of a cloud, and Moses stood with him there.

He called on the name of the Lord. The Lord passed before him and proclaimed, 'Lord, Lord, a God of tenderness and compassion, slow to anger, rich in kindness and faithfulness.' And Moses bowed down to the ground at once and worshipped. 'If I have indeed won your favour, Lord,' he said, 'let my Lord come with us, I beg. True, they are a headstrong people, but forgive us our faults and our sins, and adopt us as your heritage.'

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading – 2 Corinthians 13:11-13

Brothers, we wish you happiness; try to grow perfect; help one another. Be united; live in peace, and the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with the holy kiss. All the saints send you greetings. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

### Gospel – John 3:16-18

Jesus said to Nicodemus, 'God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life. For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved. No one who believes in him will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already, because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son.'

### REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

The readings for this feast do not directly explain the doctrine of the Trinity as we have come to know it. Rather, they offer us glimpses into the nature of our Triune God. The psalm response suggests that our primary response to God should be one of praise for the love that God has for us.

The God who is beyond our comprehension is also the God who has saved us. We see this theme in both the first reading and the gospel. The covenant language in the reading from Exodus underscores God's unfathomable goodness. God's graciousness and mercy are not rewards for our fidelity. They are extended to us in our sinfulness. It is God's saving grace that transforms us, not any merit on our part. In the gospel we are assured that Jesus was sent into the world to save it, not to condemn it.

The Trinitarian phrase found in the letter to the Corinthians is so expressive of the love that God has for us that it has been incorporated regularly into the liturgy. It declares that through his death and resurrection, Jesus has opened for us the treasury of divine grace. It also proclaims that the love of God has forged the bonds of community that unite us. Created in the image and after the likeness of this God, we are called to unity among ourselves. As incomprehensible as it may seem, it is primarily through the unity that we share that we will manifest the unity that exists in God.

### REFLECTION IN A WELL

Once a young boy stood watching a gypsy as he drank from a well in the town square. After drinking, the man continued to gaze into the well, as though looking at someone.

He was a giant of a man but had a friendly face. So the boy approached him and asked: 'Who lives down there?'

'God does,' answered the gypsy. 'Can I see him?' 'Sure you can,' said the gypsy.

Then taking the boy into his arms he lifted him up so that he could see down into the well.

All the boy could see, however, was his own reflection in the water.

'But that's only me,' he cried in disappointment. 'All I see is me.'

'Ah,' replied the gypsy,

'now, you know where God lives. He lives in you.'

### MASSES HAVE RESUMED AT OUR PARISH

With the appointment of Fr Mark Reynolds as our Parish Priest and the lifting of restrictions, St Jude's is delighted to welcome parishioners back to weekday Mass.

Mass will be celebrated every Wednesday, Thursday and Friday at 9:15am

In accordance with Government Guidelines, Mass attendance will be limited to 20 people (excluding those required to enable the service). All churches are required to comply with these restrictions and must collect a list of attendees and their contact details. This is to assist with contact tracing if there is a risk of Coronavirus transmission.

We ask that all those who wish to attend Mass at St Jude's adhere to the following process and guidelines.

How to pre-register to attend Mass:

- Email [massrequest.stjudes@gmail.com](mailto:massrequest.stjudes@gmail.com) and provide your name, email, telephone number and date you wish to attend Mass. Confirmation of your attendance will be emailed to you.
- Our preference for bookings is via email. However, if you are unable to email, please call the Parish Office during office hours Tuesday to Thursday 9.15am to 2.45pm to book.
- Alternatively leave a message outside office hours and we will return your call to confirm.
- Bookings close 24hours prior to the scheduled Mass, i.e. for 9.15am Mass on Wednesday, bookings must be received by 9.15am on Tuesday.
- Only attend the Mass that you have pre-registered and for which you have received confirmation. This will ensure that St Jude's comply with the restricted attendance and in fairness to other parishioners.
- If you cannot attend the Mass you pre-registered for, please cancel your booking to make your spot available for another person to attend a Mass.
- Make sure you have given your correct contact details when booking. This is to assist with contact tracing if there is a risk of Coronavirus transmission.
- Please do not register for multiple Masses as we would like everyone to get an opportunity to attend. We suggest you attend one Mass once a fortnight, until restrictions ease further.

When at Church:

- Sit only on the area marked 'Reserved'
- Follow social distancing rules at all times.
- Use the sanitiser provided as you enter the Church.

### **LIVING THE GOSPEL**

#### Sign of the Cross

Every time we bless ourselves or begin prayer with the sign of the cross, we reaffirm our belief in the Trinity. That seemingly simple prayer, 'In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit,' is, in fact, a confirmation of our belief in a triune God – three in one. The earliest use of the sign of the cross only involved tracing a small cross with the thumb or finger on the forehead as it is still done in baptisms or blessings today. Later, describing the shape of the cross on forehead, abdomen and shoulders became the common practice.
