Serve the Lord with Joy

1st Reading – Deuteronomy 8:2-3. 14-16

Moses said to the people: 'Remember how the Lord your God led you for forty years in the wilderness, to humble you, to test you and know your inmost heart – whether you would keep his commandments or not. He humbled you, he made you feel hunger, he fed you with manna which neither you nor your fathers had known, to make you understand that man does not live on bread alone but that man lives on everything that comes from the mouth of the Lord.

'Do not then forget the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery: who guided you through this vast and dreadful wilderness, a land of fiery serpents, scorpions, thirst; who in this waterless place brought you water from the hardest rock; who in this wilderness fed you with manna that your fathers had not known.'

2nd Reading – 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

The blessing-cup that we bless is a communion with the blood of Christ, and the bread that we break is a communion with the body of Christ. The fact that there is only one loaf means that, though there are many of us, we form a single body because we all have a share in this one loaf.

Gospel – John 6:51-58

Jesus said to the Jews: 'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.' Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said. Jesus replied: 'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink.

He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.'

REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

This feast harkens back to the celebration of Holy Thursday. By way of the metaphors of food and drink, its readings provide us with a look at the mystery of divine presence. They first provide a picture of a God who feeds us. In the past God set a table in freedom, and then provided food that enabled our ancestors to survive. God fed those who were needy, not those who were worthy. Jesus offered sustenance to the crowds that gathered around him. It was not manna from heaven that he offered but his own flesh and blood as food and drink. This food and drink are the pledge of eternal life.

Those who eat this bread and drink this cup are caught up in a profound unity with God, a unity not envisioned in the wilderness experience. There is a new overlay of significance. Jesus' claim to give his flesh and blood was a bold one, Paul's seems even bolder. He states that partaking of the bread and the cup not only joins us with Christ, but actually makes us participants in the body and blood of Christ. Humanity and divinity are joined as one. The Eucharist is a sign of unity in another way. Joined to the body and blood of Christ, we are joined to each other. We are one body and that body is Christ. The Eucharist is truly a celebration of thanksgiving: thanksgiving for our transformation and thanksgiving for our unity.

LIVING GOSPEL

Meals are very important events. Not only do we physically need food and drink to keep ourselves alive, but we use meals to mark occasions and celebrate events: birthdays; weddings; dates; achievements; disappointments; reunions. There is a sacredness about gathering with friends and family and sharing a meal together. Stories are told; memories shared; the food is appreciated and more often than not there's a drink to accompany the meal. Treating such occasions with gratitude – as blessed moments of grace – is living out the Eucharistic reality of welcoming Jesus into our lives and seeking to be more like him.

MASSES HAVE RESUMED AT OUR PARISH

With the appointment of Fr Mark Reynolds as our Parish Priest and the lifting of restrictions, St Jude's is delighted to welcome parishioners back to weekday and weekend Mass.

Our Mass timings are as follows -

Wednesday, Thursday and Friday	9:15am
Saturday	6:00pm
Sunday	8:30am, 10:30am and 5:00pm.

In accordance with Government Guidelines, Mass attendance will be limited to 20 people (excluding those required to enable the service). All churches are required to comply with these restrictions and must collect a list of attendees and their contact details. This is to assist with contact tracing if there is a risk of Coronavirus transmission.

We ask that all those who wish to attend Mass at St Jude's adhere to the following process and guidelines.

How to pre-register to attend Mass:

1. Email massrequest.stjudes@gmail.com and provide your name, email, telephone number and date you wish to attend Mass. Confirmation of your attendance will be emailed to you.
2. Our preference for bookings is via email. However, if you are unable to email, please call the Parish Office during office hours Tuesday to Thursday 9.15am to 2.45pm to book.
3. Alternatively leave a message outside office hours and we will return your call to confirm. For weekday Mass Bookings close 24 hours prior to the scheduled Mass, i.e. for 9.15am Mass on Wednesday, bookings must be received by 9.15am on Tuesday.
4. For weekend Mass Bookings close 12:00pm Friday prior to weekend
5. Only attend the Mass that you have pre-registered and for which you have received confirmation. This will ensure that St Jude's comply with the restricted attendance and in fairness to other parishioners.
6. If you cannot attend the Mass you pre-registered for, please cancel your booking to make your spot available for another person to attend a Mass.
7. Make sure you have given your correct contact details when booking. This is to assist with contact tracing if there is a risk of Coronavirus transmission.
8. Please do not register for multiple Masses as we would like everyone to get an opportunity to attend. We suggest you attend one Mass once a fortnight, until restrictions ease further.

When at Church:

1. Sit only on the area marked 'Reserved'
2. Follow social distancing rules at all times.
3. Use the sanitiser provided as you enter the Church.
