Serve the Lord with Joy

1st Reading – Jeremiah 20:10-13

Jeremiah said: 'I hear so many disparaging me, "Terror from every side! Denounce him! Let us denounce him!" All those who used to be my friends watched for my downfall, "Perhaps he will be seduced into error. Then we will master him and take our revenge!" But the Lord is at my side, a mighty hero; my opponents will stumble, mastered, confounded by their failure; everlasting, unforgettable disgrace will be theirs. But you, Lord of Hosts, you who probe with justice, who scrutinise the loins and heart, let me see the vengeance you will take on them, for I have committed my cause to you. Sing to the Lord, praise the Lord, for he has delivered the soul of the needy from the hands of evil men.'

2nd Reading – Romans 5:12-15

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law-breaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law. Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.

Gospel – Matthew 10:26-33

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Do not be afraid. For everything that is now covered will be uncovered, and everything now hidden will be made clear. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the daylight; what you hear in whispers, proclaim from the house-tops. 'Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; fear him rather who can destroy both body and soul in hell. Can you not buy two sparrows for a penny? And yet not one falls to the ground without your Father knowing. Why, every hair on your head has been counted. So there is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than hundreds of sparrows. 'So if anyone declares himself for me in the presence of men, I will declare myself for him in the presence of my Father in heaven. But the one who disowns me in the presence of men, I will disown in the presence of my Father in heaven.'

REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

The demands of discipleship can be very difficult. The strength that is needed to continue on the chosen path despite its hardships can come only from God. We live in a world that desperately needs to hear the call to conversion, but it is a world that is subject to the death that entered it through the sin of Adam. Those who answer the call of God may have to face the hostility of this world, because their values and their commitment to righteousness threaten its moorings. To commit oneself to the reign of God is to challenge the reign of the world, and this can make one very unpopular. In the midst of this suffering we can find strength in the promises of God, and we believe that God is faithful to these promises. Only half of today's picture is bleak. The other half is radiant with hope. Paul assures us that the gracious gift that God offers us is far greater than the transgressions brought on by sin. This gracious gift is Jesus Christ himself. The gift exceeds anything for which we might have hoped. He is the comfort that will carry us through our disappointments. He is the strength that will enable us to endure the misunderstanding and hardship that come with discipleship. We are called to acknowledge him before the world, and we are promised that if we do, he will acknowledge us before God. There is light even in the midst of darkness. There is hope even in the midst of suffering.

CONFIRMATION

Confirmation classes for our young people who don't attend either St Jude's or Holy Trinity will begin in early Term 3. The classes will be held as usual on a Sunday morning over four consecutive Sundays. Whilst we don't as yet have a date on which we will be celebrating the sacrament we thought it best to at least have our young people prepared. MASSES HAVE RESUMED AT OUR PARISH (Update)

With the easing of restrictions, Fr Mark is delighted to welcome parishioners back to weekday and weekend Mass. **Our Mass times are as follows -**

- Wednesday, Thursday and Friday 9:15am
- Saturday 6:00pm
- Sunday 8:30am, 10:30am and **5:00pm.**

As per Government Guidelines, Mass attendance is limited to 20 people (excluding those required to enable the service). All churches must comply with these restrictions, which include collecting contact details of those attending, to assist with contact tracing if there is a risk of Coronavirus transmission. Therefore, all those who wish to attend Mass must register.

How to register to attend Mass:

1. Register using trybooking.com, <https://www.trybooking.com/BJXRT> – this is our preferred method, as you can register at any time. If you are unable to use trybooking.com, please register using one of the methods below.
2. Email massrequest.stjudes@gmail.com and provide your name, telephone number and Mass time that you wish to attend. Your email will be responded to within 24 hours with confirmation of your attendance.
3. Call the Parish Office during office hours (Tuesday to Thursday 9.15 am to 2.45) pm to register, or leave a message outside office hours and we will return your call to confirm.

If registering by trybooking.com, registrations will remain open until 6 hours before Mass, unless the Mass is full.

If registering through one of the alternate methods, you must register at least 24 hours before the scheduled Mass time.

Only attend that Mass for which you have pre-registered and for which you have received confirmation. This will ensure that St Jude's comply with the restricted attendance and in fairness to other parishioners.

If you cannot attend the Mass you pre-registered for, please cancel your booking (either directly in trybooking.com or send an email to massrequest.stjudes@gmail.com) to enable another person to attend the Mass.

Please do not register for multiple Masses so that all parishioners have the opportunity to attend. We suggest you attend one Mass per fortnight, until restrictions ease further.
