#### PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

In a spirit of Pastoral Outreach of St. Jude's Parish, we, the people of the parish, are called to "Serve the Lord with Joy". We respect diversity and welcome all who choose to belong to our community. By sharing our gifts and resources generously, we support and encourage all people who come our way.

Let all our voices be heard in a spirit of openness that fosters ongoing

communication across our Parish.

None of us were alive in 1891, 120 years ago, but that year, on the 15th May, Pope Leo XIII document 'Rerum Novarum' which means 'On the Dignity of Work' was published. After the Gospels, it really is the foundational document of Catholic Social Teaching, or Social Iustice. I thought back to the document this week when the Federal Government announced an increase to the Jobseeker payment of just \$3.57 per day which is \$50 per fortnight. A couple of the principles of the Papal document are worthy of consideration. It spoke of the importance of the 'dignity of work', and that's the work of ALL, and of the need for just wages, amongst other things. Sadly there has existed in this country, certainly amongst some, and for a long while, an attitude which says the worker is of lesser value or significance than others. That hardly equates with the Christian principle of the 'dignity of the human person'. The National President of the St Vincent de Paul Society, Claire Victory, said in response the Government's announcement: "Twenty-five dollars a week (increase) is an inadequate response to the poverty experienced by people forced to survive on unemployment benefits. The rhetoric that the best form of income support is a job is unpalatable, especially when there remains nine applicants looking for a job or increased hours for every job advertised." And Jesuit Social Services Chief Executive, Julie Edwards, said: "(This increase) will continue to keep Jobseeker recipients below the poverty line and mean that they will be forced to struggle for essentials that every Australian needs, such as housing, food and medication. This does not allow people to lead a dignified life and does not give them the opportunities they need to flourish and reach their potential."

Very sad, it seems to me.

# Serve the Lord with Joy

## 1st Reading—Genesis 22:1-2 9-13 15-18

God put Abraham to the test. 'Abraham, Abraham,' he called.' Here I am' he replied. 'Take your son,' God said 'your only child Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him as a burnt offering, on a mountain I will point out to you.'

When they arrived at the place God had pointed out to him, Abraham built an altar there, and arranged the wood. Then he bound his son Isaac and put him on the altar on top of the wood. Abraham stretched out his hand and seized the knife to kill his son.

But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven. 'Abraham, Abraham' he said. 'I am here' he replied. 'Do not raise your hand against the boy' the angel said. 'Do not harm him, for now I know you fear God. You have not refused me your son, your only son.' Then looking up, Abraham saw a ram caught by its horns in a bush. Abraham took the ram and offered it as a burnt offering in place of his son.

The angel of the Lord called Abraham a second time from heaven. 'I swear by my own self—it is the Lord who speaks—because you have done this, because you have not refused me your son, your only son, I will shower blessings on you, I will make your descendants as many as the starts of heaven and the grains of sand on the seashore. Your descendants shall gain possession of the gates of your enemies. All the nations of the earth shall bless themselves by your descendants, as a reward for your obedience.'

#### 2nd Reading—Romans 8:31-34

With God on our side who can be against us? Since God did not spare his own Son, but gave him up to benefit us all, we may be certain, after such a gift, that he will not refuse anything he can give. Could anyone accuse those that God has chosen? When God acquits, could anyone condemn? Could Christ Jesus? No! He not only died for us—he rose from the dead, and there at God's right hand he stands and pleads for us.

#### Gospel-Mark 9:2-10

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.
