SACRAMENT OF FIRST EUCHARIST Saturday 14th September- 2pm OR 4pm Mass



First Reading: Isaiah 35:4-7

Say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid. 'Look, your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you.' Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy; for water gushes in the desert, streams in the wasteland, the scorched earth becomes a lake, the parched land springs of water.'

Gospel: Mark 7:31-37

Returning from the district of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the sea of Galilee, right through the Decapolis region. And they brought him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha,' that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. 'He has done all things well,' they said 'he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.'

REFLECTION

Mark 7:31-37 tells the story of Jesus healing a deaf man with a speech impediment. Through this encounter, we see Jesus' deep compassion and care for those who are marginalised or burdened by physical limitations. He takes the man aside, away from the crowd, and ministers to him in an intimate and personal way. This passage invites us to reflect on how we respond to those in need of healing, both physically and spiritually. Are we willing to listen and show compassion like Jesus did? His word, "Ephphatha" (Be opened), is a call for us to open our hearts to the suffering of others and to allow God to work through us in bringing healing and love to the world. Moreover, the healing reminds us of the power of silence and presence. Jesus didn't need many words; His touch and care were enough. It's a reminder that sometimes, we don't need to have all the answers or perfect words—our love and willingness to accompany others in their pain are enough.

Loving God,

Open our hearts to your healing grace, as you opened the ears of the deaf man. Help us to listen with compassion and speak words of kindness. **Amen**

Second Reading: James 2:1-5

My brothers, do not try to combine faith in Jesus Christ, our glorified Lord, with the making of distinctions between classes of people. Now suppose a man comes into your synagogue, beautifully dressed and with a gold ring on, and at the same time a poor man comes in, in shabby clothes, and you take notice of the well-dressed man, and say, 'Come this way to the best seats'; then you tell the poor man, 'Stand over there' or 'You can sit on the floor by my foot-rest.' Can't you see that you have used two different standards in your mind, and turned yourselves into judges, and corrupt judges at that?

Listen, my dear brothers: it was those who are poor according to the world that God chose, to be rich in faith and to be the heirs to the kingdom which he promised to those who love him.



MULTICULTURAL ROSARY WITH ADORATION AND BENEDICTION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT


