
St. Jude the Apostle Parish- 49 George St, Scoresby

"In a spirit of Pastoral outreach, we, the people of the Parish, are called to serve with joy."







In this passage from Mark's Gospel, Jesus speaks of His impending suffering and death, yet the disciples are preoccupied with a very human concern: who among them is the greatest. Jesus, aware of their conversation doesn't rebuke them but uses it as a teaching moment. He turns the idea of greatness on its head, saying, "if anyone wants to be first, he must be the very last, and the servant of all". He then takes a child in His arms and tells them that welcoming a child is akin to welcoming Him and, ultimately God. This message is a radical invitation to reconsider how we define greatness. In our world, greatness is often associated with power, prestige, and influence. But Jesus calls us to look beyond these external markers and focus on what truly matters: love and humility. To love as Christ loves is to put others before ourselves, to seek not our own greatness, but to lift others up. True love, the love that Jesus embodies, is selfless and sacrificial. It calls us to serve, especially those who are vulnerable, like the child Jesus uses in His example. The child represents those who are often overlooked or considered insignificant in society. In Jesus' time, children had no status or power. By embracing the child, Jesus shows us that love does not seek recognition or reward. Instead, it serves the least among us, those who cannot repay us. This Passage challenges us to live a life rooted in SERVICES love—love that seeks not greatness for ourselves, but the greatness that comes from humbly serving others. In God's kingdom, the greatest are those who love most deeply, who like Christ, are willing to sacrifice for others.

Lord, guide my heart today. Fill me with Your love and peace. Help me to serve others with humility and kindness. Amen

First Reading: Wisdom 2:12, 17-20

The godless say to themselves,

'Let us lie in wait for the virtuous man, since he annoys us and opposes our way of life, reproaches us for our breaches of the law and accuses us of playing false to our upbringing. Let us see if what he says is true, let us observe what kind of end he himself will have. If the virtuous man is God's son, God will take his part and rescue him from the clutches of his enemies. Let us test him with cruelty and with torture, and thus explore this gentleness of his and put his endurance to the proof. Let us condemn him to a shameful death since he will be looked after – we have his word for it.'

Second Reading: James 3:16-4:3

Wherever you find jealousy and ambition, you find disharmony, and wicked things of every kind being done; whereas the wisdom that comes down from above is essentially something pure; it also makes for peace, and is kindly and considerate; it is full of compassion and shows itself by doing good; nor is there any trace of partiality or hypocrisy in it. Peacemakers, when they work for peace, sow the seeds which will bear fruit in holiness. Where do these wars and battles between yourselves first start? Isn't it precisely in the desires fighting inside your own selves? You want something and you haven't got it; so you are prepared to kill. You have an ambition that you cannot satisfy; so you fight to get your way by force. Why you don't have what you want is because you don't pray for it; when you do pray and don't get it, it is because you have not prayed properly, you have prayed for something to indulge your own desires.



Gospel: Mark 9:30-37

After leaving the mountain Jesus and his disciples made their way through Galilee; and he did not want anyone to know, because he was instructing his disciples; he was telling them, 'The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of men; they will put him to death; and three days after he has been put to death he will rise again.' But they did not understand what he said and were afraid to ask him. They came to Capernaum, and when he was in the house he asked them, 'What were you arguing about on the road?' They said nothing because they had been arguing which of them was the greatest. So he sat down, called the Twelve to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all.' He then took a little child, set him in front of them, put his arms round him, and said to them, 'Anyone who welcomes one of these little children in my name, welcomes me; and anyone who welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me.'

On Wednesday, 9 October, 2024, our multicultural rosary, adoration and benediction of the Blessed Sacrament will be held at St Jude's parish church from 7.30 – 8.30 pm. 
