# Reflection

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the vinevard owner who entrusted his vinevard to tenants. Despite the owner's trust and patience, the tenants mistreated his servants and eventually killed his son.

The parable reminds us of God's continuous grace and patience with humanity.



We are the caretakers of the vineyard, and God has entrusted us with his creation, gifts and opportunities. Just as the tenants in the parable were expected to produce good fruits, we too are called to bear the fruits of love, compassion, and righteousness in our lives.

However, sometimes we fall short, just like the tenants who mistreated the owner's servants. But God's grace is boundless, and he gives us chances to repent and turn back to Him. The parable serves as a caution against neglecting God's will and a reminder of the consequences of rejecting His love.

The ultimate message is one of hope and redemption. God sent His Son, Jesus, to show us the way and provide a path to reconciliation. When we accept His guidance and return to Him, we become part of the true vineyard, producing the fruits of the Kingdom of God.

Let us be mindful of our responsibility, strive to bear good fruits in our lives, always mindful of God's boundless love and patience.

Lord forgive us for any moments of neglect or rejection of your will and love. Grant us the wisdom to heed your guidance and seek reconciliation with you. In Jesus name, we pray. Amen

# First Reading: Isaiah 5:1-7

Let me sing to my friend the song of his love for his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside. He dug the soil, cleared it of stones, and planted choice vines in it. In the middle he built a tower, he dug a press there too. He expected it to yield grapes, but sour grapes were all that it gave. And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, I ask you to judge between my vineyard and me. What could I have done for my vineyard that I have not done? I expected it to yield grapes. Why did it yield sour grapes instead? Very well I will tell you what I am going to do to my vineyard: I will take away its hedge for it to be grazed on, and knock down its wall for it to be trampled on. I will lay it waste, unpruned, undug; overgrown by the briar and the thorn. I will command the clouds to rain on it. Yes, the vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the House of Israel, and the men of Judah that chosen plant. He expected justice, but found bloodshed, integrity, but only a cry of distress.

# Second Reading: Philippians 4:6-9

There is no need to worry; but if there is anything you need, pray for it, asking God for it with prayer and thanksgiving, and that peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hears and your thoughts, in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers, fill your minds with everything that is true, everything that is noble, everything that is good and pure, everything that we love and honour, and everything that can be thought virtuous or worthy of praise. Keep doing all the things that you learnt from me and have been taught by me and have heard or seen that I do. Then the God of peace will be with you.

# Gospel: Matthew 21:33-43

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son", he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Com on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance". So they seized him and threw him out o the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' The Answered, "He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures: It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone. This was the Lord's doing and it is a wonderful to see? 'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people wo will produce its fruit.'


