The following is an extract from an article by Fr Bernard Teo who spoke at St Simon's Tuesday evening it is well worth reading.

One of Francis' first public acts after taking office close to Holy Week, 2013, was a big surprise and shock to the Vatican establishment . Instead of washing twelve cardinals' feet during Holy Thursdays' Mass of the Last Supper, which has a long standing practice in the Vatican tradition,

Francis went to the Casal del Marmo prison on the outskirts of Rome and washed the feet of twelve young prisoners. Among them were women and two Muslims. That created a stir of discussions within Vatican circles and elsewhere about this unprecedented act, particularly when they centred around the washing of women's feet. And Muslims? - unheard of. Any ecclesiastic of lesser rank would have been disciplined in some way for these unorthodox liturgical acts. But then he is Pope! What could we do with him? I remember one conclusion drawn in Vatican canonical discussion circles on this unprecedented act was that he had not broken any divine law.

These discussions, however, seem to have missed a glaringly important point. Something, and someone, new is here. With the washing of these particular people's feet, Francis had given the first clear signal of what his pontificate was going to look like. He intends to be, first and foremost, a bold universal pastor after the heart of the Good Shepherd, from whom he received his mission and mandate through the church. No one, and particularly the least, is ever going to be ignored or forgotten. His priority is to bring attention to the little people, those who are ignored or thought to be best left forgotten, as they are an embarrassment to establishment circles. He intends to bring into prominent focus and into public consciousness all those who suffer in one form or another. Like the Good Shepherd, he wants to give a clear signal that they are all important to him, and to God.

And the challenge for us to be like the Good Shepherd.

First Reading: 2 Kgs 5:14-17

Naaman the leper went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, as Elisha had told him to do. And his flesh became clean once more like the flesh of a little child.

Returning to Elisha with his whole escort, he went in and stood before him. 'Now I know' he said, 'that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel. Now, please, accept a present from your servant.' But Elisha replied, 'As the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will accept nothing.' Naaman pressed him to accept, but he refused. Then Naaman said, 'Since your answer is "No," allow your servant to be given as much earth as two mules may carry, because your servant will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any god except the Lord.'

Second Reading: 2 Tim 2:8-13

Remember the Good News that I carry. 'Jesus Christ risen from the dead, sprung from the race of David'; it is on account of this that I have my own hardships to bear, even to being chained like a criminal – but they cannot chain up God's news. So I bear it all for the sake of those who are chosen, so that in the end they may have the salvation that is in Christ Jesus and the eternal glory that comes with it.

Here is a saying that you can rely on:

If we have died with him, then we shall live with him.

If we hold firm, then we shall reign with him.

If we disown him, then he will disown us.

We may be unfaithful, but he is always faithful,

for he cannot disown his own self.

Gospel: Lk 17:11-19

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered one of the villages, ten lepers came to meet him. They stood some way off and called to him, 'Jesus! Master! Take pity on us.' When he saw them he said, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' Now as they were going away they were cleansed. Finding himself cured, one of them turned back praising God at the top of his voice and threw himself at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. This made Jesus say, 'Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.' And he said to the man, 'Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you.'
