

Feast of St. Jude & St. Simon The Apostles

This weekend both parish communities celebrate the feast days of our patron saints, ss. Simon and Jude. They were two of the twelve Apostles chosen by Jesus and were part of the group that followed Him closely and helped spread His teachings.

Simon is called "the Zealot" to show he had great passion for his faith. He may have been part of a group called the Zealots, who wanted to free the Jewish people from Roman rule. After Jesus' resurrection, Simon travelled to different places to preach about Jesus. Jude is often called "Thaddeus" who is especially well-known as the patron saint of hopeless cases. Many people pray to him when they are facing difficult situations and feel like there is no way out. He has become a symbol of hope for those who are struggling.

These two saints are remembered together because they are believed to have worked together in their missionary efforts. Tradition says they both preached in Persia and were martyred for their faith. Like Ss Simon and Jude, I invite both communities to come together and work as one towards a goal of being a missionary community.

It's interesting to note that Jesus chose a variety of different people as His Apostles. Perhaps the most stark contrast is found between Simon the Zealot and Matthew the tax collector. As a zealot, Simon would have been very committed to his Jewish identity and would have been firmly opposed to Roman oppression and taxation. He would have had an immediate aversion to Matthew, who previously served the Romans by collecting taxes for them from the Jews. The fact that Jesus did not choose like-minded Apostles shows His inclusion of all people. Jesus did not have a favourite type of person. He was not bound by cultural ties, ideologies, or social classes. He was interested in all people, those of every background and experience and His Apostles reveal that fact.

Together, Simon and Jude represent two important aspects of Christian life: perseverance and hope. Simon's zeal for faith and Jude's role as a helper in desperate situations give believers examples of how to live out their faith with strength and trust in God.

Both of these saints remind us that we each have a mission. Like Simon and Jude, we are called to share the message of Christ with others. This doesn't always mean traveling far or facing danger, but it does mean living out our faith each day. We can do this by being kind, serving others, and showing people what it means to follow Jesus.

Finally, these saints show us the power of teamwork. I am particularly excited to emphasize the importance of collaboration between our two communities. Together, we can be a powerful witness to the love of Jesus in the world today. By sharing our gifts, resources, and enthusiasm, we can amplify our impact and reach those in need more effectively. Let us use this feast as a reminder that we are stronger together as a community.

Thank you for your commitment to our faith community. Let us come together to strengthen our faith and serve our Lord together. **Fr Jerald.**

The Lord says this: Shout with joy for Jacob! Hail the chief of nations! Proclaim! Praise! Shout: The Lord has saved his people, the remnant of Israel! See, I will bring them back from the land of the North and gather them from the far ends of earth; all of them: the blind and the lame, women with child, women in labour: a great company returning here. They had left in tears, I will comfort them as I lead them back; I will guide them to streams of water, by a smooth path where they will not stumble. For I am a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my first-born son.

Second Reading: Hebrews 5:1-6

Every high priest has been taken out of mankind and is appointed to act for men in their relations with God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins; and so he can sympathise with those who are ignorant or uncertain because he too lives in the limitations of weakness. That is why he has to make sin offerings for himself as well as for the people. No one takes this honour on himself, but each one is called by God, as Aaron was. Nor did Christ give himself the glory of becoming high priest, but he had it from the one who said to him: You are my son, today I have become your father, and in another text: You are a priest of the order of Melchizedek, and for ever.

Gospel: Mark 10:46-52

As Jesus left Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus (that is, the son of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting at the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.




Feast Day Parish Prayer Heavenly Father,

We are pleased to announce that Adina Atmadja is our new Altar Server Coordinator. A big thank you to Adina for taking up this role!


