Gospel Reflection

Today's Gospel is one with which we are very familiar. Perhaps too familiar? Not surprisingly, the two commandments which Jesus talks about in today's Gospel are interrelated. True love of neighbour springs from our love of God. And on the other hand, we cannot truly love God if we do not love our neighbour. This is indeed better than all of the sacrifices - even for us who no longer sacrifice in the way they did at the time of Jesus. For it is easy to let ritual take the place of love. That is when we end up with a religion that is loveless. For most of us, I suspect that our greatest sin is not that we do not love our neighbours, but that we do not even know them. And if we do not even know them, how can we be neighbours in the sense the Gospel calls us to be? We end up in a sort of cold indifference. Sacred Scripture calls us to not only love our neighbours, but also to love our enemies. The reason for this is probably because they are generally the same people. And there is a very real human reason for this. We tend to think of the person far removed from us in the right way – we think of them as a person and as our neighbour. But the person who lives next door to us or the person we meet in the street, or the person with whom we work, we do not like to think of any of these people as our neighbour. We tend to de-personalise our dealings with them. They become no more than a problem for us; a barking dog, a nuisance, an irritation. For us, by and large, they are not persons. Many of us are caused problems by a particular person, be it a family member or a neighbour. What can we do? We know that we ought not retaliate. And in some ways, retaliation is the easiest thing to do. No. We are actually called to do a much harder thing. We are called to pray for the one who causes us problems. And if we can allow our hearts to be filled with love for a person, then there is no room for bitterness and hatred to accumulate in our hearts. This, of course, is not easy. But this is our call.

First Reading: Deuteronomy 6:2-6

Moses said to the people: 'If you fear the Lord your God all the days of your life and if you keep all his laws and commandments which I lay on you, you will have a long life, you and your son and your grandson. Listen then, Israel, keep and observe what will make you prosper and give you great increase, as the Lord God of your fathers has promised you, giving you a land where milk and honey flow. 'Listen, Israel: The Lord our God is the one Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength. Let these words I urge on you today be written on your heart.'

Second Reading: Hebrews 7:23-28

There used to be a great number of priests under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, Christ, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him. To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

Gospel: Mark 12:28-34

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him any more.






