Xavier David has done in regard to this and I am pleased to advise that we are installing solar panels in January and early February next year. This initiative also includes the house and parish office.

"Tennis Club"

Over many years and after being a vital part of the life of St Jude's Parish our Tennis Club has been slowly diminishing in more recent years to the point there are no longer any members. This has been the worry with many tennis clubs both parish and suburban over recent years. One of the things that is absolutely certain is that parishes without a stream of income in addition to parish stewardship offerings will struggle to survive in the medium to long term. To help ensure that St Jude's Parish is not one of those parishes the development of the "tennis court site" has been under exploration for some time and I have established a Working Party under the leadership of Vito Trifilo to explore some possibility of site development, and to this end we are working in conjunction with the Property and Infrastructure personnel of the Archdiocese. At this stage it is too early to indicate precisely "what or when" but our early thinking is around the development of early learning facilities or retirement. Realistically any such development is 3-5 years away. The Parish Pastoral Council has endorsed this initiative.

Any thoughts would be most welcome.

First Reading: Is 35:1-6 10

Let the wilderness and the dry-lands exult, let the wasteland rejoice and bloom, let it bring forth flowers like the jonquil, let it rejoice and sing for joy.

The glory of Lebanon is bestowed on it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they shall see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God.

Strengthen all weary hands, steady all trembling knees and say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid. 'Look, your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you.'

Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy, for those the Lord has ransomed shall return.

They will come to Zion shouting for joy, everlasting joy on their faces; joy and gladness will go with them and sorrow and lament be ended.

Second Reading: Jas 5:7-10

Be patient, brothers, until the Lord's coming. Think of a farmer: how patiently he waits for the precious fruit of the ground until it has had the autumn rains and the spring rains! You too have to be patient; do not lose heart, because the Lord's coming will be soon. Do not make complaints against one another, brothers, so as not to be brought to judgement yourselves; the Judge is already to be seen waiting at the gates. For your example, brothers, in submitting with patience, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

Gospel: Mt 11:2-11

John in his prison had heard what Christ was doing and he sent his disciples to ask him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or have we got to wait for someone else?' Jesus answered, 'Go back and tell John what you hear and see; the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor; and happy is the man who does not lose faith in me.'

As the messengers were leaving, Jesus began to talk to the people about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed swaying in the breeze? No? Then what did you go out to see? A man wearing fine clothes? Oh no, those who wear fine clothes are to be found in palaces. Then what did you go out for? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and much more than a prophet: he is the one of whom scripture says: Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way before you. I tell you solemnly, of all the children born of women, a greater than John the Baptist has never been seen; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is.'


