First Reading: Ecclesiasticus 27:4-7

In a shaken sieve the rubbish is left behind, so too the defects of a man appear in his talk. The kiln tests the work of the potter, the test of a man is in his conversation. The orchard where the tree grows is judged on the quality of its fruit, similarly a man's words betray what he feels. Do not praise a man before he has spoken, since this is the test of men.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:54-58

When this perishable nature has put on imperishability, and when this mortal nature has put on immortality, then the words of scripture will come true: Death is swallowed up in victory. Death, where is your victory? Death, where is your sting? Now the sting of death is sin, and sin gets its power from the Law. So let us thank God for giving us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Never give in then, my dear brothers, never admit defeat; keep on working at the Lord's work always, knowing that, in the Lord, you cannot be labouring in vain.

Gospel: Luke 6:39-45

Jesus told a parable to his disciples, 'Can one blind man guide another? Surely both will fall into a pit? The disciple is not superior to his teacher; the fully trained disciple will always be like his teacher. Why do you observe the splinter in your brother's eye and never notice the plank in your own? How can you say to your brother, "Brother, let me take out the splinter that is in your eye," when you cannot see the plank in your own? Hypocrite! Take the plank out of your own eye first, and then you will see clearly enough to take out the splinter that is in your brother's eye.

'There is no sound tree that produces rotten fruit, nor again a rotten tree that produces sound fruit. For every tree can be told by its own fruit: people do not pick figs from thorns, nor gather grapes from brambles. A good man draws what is good from the store of goodness in his heart; a bad man draws what is bad from the store of badness. For a man's words flow out of what fills his heart.'

The check-in process is as follows:

- 1) Face masks will no longer be required for gatherings indoors from 11.59pm Friday 25 February 2022. However, for the time being, this is optional and you are welcomed to wear a face mask if this is your preference.
- 2) The scanning of the QR code is no longer necessary.
- 3) Please sanitise your hands on entry to the church & social distance where possible.

The Lenten Season Approaches

As Lent approaches each year, our minds turn to, "what will we do; what will we give up?".

Instead of giving up, why not put something in ... something that will take hold and stay with us for the rest of our lives since Lent is about change/conversion. Remember that real penance is to live life well: to be the mercy and peace of God toward others.

Perhaps one or two of these ideas will be helpful:

- 1) As you read/hear the Gospel for the First Sunday of Lent, and reflect on the Spirit driving Jesus to the desert, what is the Spirit driving you, dragging you, to do this Lent? Lent is about God calling us, not us deciding ... but what God wants of us. 2) Give something away every day (or once a week if every day is too challenging). It could be money, but it doesn't have
- to be. A smile, a compliment, or a helping hand, sometimes, is more appreciated, more necessary, and harder to give.
- 3) Forgive a long-held grudge. Forgiving someone else will bless you as much - if not more - than the person you forgive.
- Pray for strangers. In addition to praying for your family/friends, cultivate the habit of praying for people in line at the 4) grocery store, for mourners in a funeral procession, for ambulance passengers, for people in the news, for those beyond our borders, etc.
- 5) Complaining Fast. Try to refrain from all whining and complaining. See if this doesn't help you become more aware of all the good things in your life.
- 6) The Present Moment. Remind yourself of God's presence with you, by taking a few moments several times a day, to repeat: "God is near, God is here. God is supporting me at each and every moment of my life."

We begin our Lenten Season with Ash Wednesday. Masses will be held on Wednesday 2nd March at 9.15am & 7.30pm.

We will also have Stations of the Cross every Friday evening at 7.30pm, starting from Friday 4 March.

As we approach Lent and Easter, our Liturgies will need to be adapted to ensure personal safety of all. The times of our liturgies may also need to be adjusted to enable Fr Mark & Fr Samuel to attend to the needs of the parishes and schools of St Simon's, Holy Trinity & St Jude's.
