Our Parish: A Spiritual Home

This week, our Archbishop, Peter A Comensoli, released a pastoral letter to all of us Catholics here in Melbourne called *Welcome Home*. You can find copies in the parish foyer and I encourage you to take one with you today and have a read.



Reflecting on the difficulties of the past couple of years, our Archbishop extols the importance of parish communities gathering together each week for Sunday Mass. There are many reasons why coming to Sunday Mass is important, but I just want to reflect on two of them.

Our Catholic faith teaches us that just as God rested on the seventh day.

Our Catholic faith teaches us that just as God rested on the seventh day from all his work, human life has a rhythm of work and rest. The institution of the Lord's Day helps everyone enjoy adequate rest and leisure to cultivate their familial, cultural, social, and religious lives. Sunday helps us to cultivate our 'hope of health and well-being' in that perennial quest for balance in work and life. Even when we can't rest on Sunday itself, like our hardworking healthcare workers, the example (Genesis 2:2) and wisdom (Exodus 20:8-11) of our loving God (that divine worker), instils in us the necessity that we take time to do so, not just for our bodies but for our soul too.

Our Catholic faith also teaches us, that all of us participating in the celebration of the Sunday Eucharist are a witness of belonging and of being faithful to Christ and to his Church. Together we testify to God's holiness, goodness and our hope of eternal 'holy communion'; a beingwith God in friendship after we die.

We are also strengthened by one another under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. In a way, Christians need Christians to be Christian! Our gathering together actually nourishes our faith and Jesus himself promises us that gathered together in his name, "I am there in the midst of them" (Matt. 18:19–20). In the unique gathering together that is the mass, Christ's Body and Blood are given to us sacramentally in the Holy Eucharist. What appears as food for our body actually has become food for our soul. You might like to prayerfully read Chapter 6 of John's Gospel with this in mind. Our coming to mass becomes a loving response to the God who has loved us first.

Through the mass, prayer, friendship, charity, hospitality and welcome our parishes are a neighbourhood spiritual home for each of us. If you know someone who has been away for a while, let's welcome them back.

Serve the Lord with Joy

First Reading: 2 Sim 5:1-3

All the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron. 'Look' they said 'we are your own flesh and blood. In days past when Saul was our king, it was you who led Israel in all their exploits; and the Lord said to you, "You are the man who shall be shepherd of my people Israel, you shall be the leader of Israel." So all the elders of Israel came to the king at Hebron, and King David made a pact with them at Hebron in the presence of the Lord, and they anointed David king of Israel.

Second Reading: Col 1:12-20

We give thanks to the Father who has made it possible for you to join the saints and with them to inherit the light.

Because that is what he has done: he has taken us out of the power of darkness and created a place for us in the kingdom of the Son that he loves, and in him, we gain our freedom, the forgiveness of our sins.

He is the image of the unseen God and the first-born of all creation, for in him were created all things in heaven and on earth: everything visible and everything invisible, Thrones, Dominations, Sovereignties, Powers – all things were created through him and for him. Before anything was created, he existed, and he holds all things in unity. Now the Church is his body, he is its head.

As he is the Beginning, he was first to be born from the dead, so that he should be first in every way; because God wanted all perfection to be found in him and all things to be reconciled through him and for him, everything in heaven and everything on earth, when he made peace by his death on the cross.

Gospel: Lk 23:35-43

The people stayed there before the cross watching Jesus. As for the leaders, they jeered at him. 'He saved others,' they said, 'let him save himself if he is the Christ of God, the Chosen One.' The soldiers mocked him too, and when they approached to offer him vinegar they said, 'If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself.' Above him there was an inscription: 'This is the King of the Jews.'

One of the criminals hanging there abused him. 'Are you not the Christ?' he said. 'Save yourself and us as well.' But the other spoke up and rebuked him. 'Have you no fear of God at all?' he said. 'You got the same sentence as he did, but in our case we deserved it: we are paying for what we did. But this man has done nothing wrong. Jesus,' he said, 'remember me when you come into your kingdom.' 'Indeed, I promise you,' he replied, 'today you will be with me in paradise.'

It is actually the whole Psalm that is the response to the First Reading, not the line that we currently say. To give the Psalm it's due position as a response the Liturgy Team have decided that we should all pray the Psalm together. This will commence on the first Sunday of Advent, the beginning of the Church's Liturgical Year and it will be explained again at each Mass that weekend. Fr Mark
