Why are there different names for the Holy Spirit?

The Gospel of John speaks of a 'Paraclete'. The word 'Paraclete' comes from the Greek *paraklētōs*, which is unique to the Gospel of John. While often thought to have originated in ancient Greek legal terminology, it has the meaning of supporter or assistant. The words Paralegal and Paramedic have their origins here. It can be understood in a passive sense as "one called alongside to help" (and so to 'advocate'). It can also have an active sense, meaning 'to intercede, entreat, appeal to'. In the Christian tradition, the understanding of the term is considered to be inclusive of terms like consolation, a guide, comforter, helper and teacher.

Interestingly, Jesus prays for "another paraclete". So, is there more than one paraclete?

The words of Jesus indicate that he performs the role of a paraclete and that there will be "another paraclete" who will remain with the disciples and so becomes the ongoing presence of the revelation of God in the world to those who love Jesus. So, even though Jesus physically departs from his disciples (which we celebrated last Sunday with the Ascension), it will not be the end of God's presence with them.

Jesus' ascension, his departure from the world, is not like someone departing at the airport. But through the gift of the spirit (which we celebrate today at Pentecost), this 'other paraclete' continues the leading of the disciples into the intimacy of relationship with God the Father.

While distinct from Jesus, the spirit does not operate independently from him (John 16:13-15). It is this that allows for the steadfast witness of the disciples to the risen Jesus, for the Paraclete "will teach you everything and remind you of all that [I] told you" (John 14:26). This is not simply recollecting the past, but, through time, a deeper understanding of Jesus and what he taught. So, Jesus' mission continues into a new era with the Holy Spirit continuing Jesus' mission in and through those 'born of water and spirit' (the baptised) and who communicates truth, to those who love Jesus and keep his commandments (John 14:15).

So, the Holy Spirit continues the role of 'Paraclete', working within the disciples to empower and sustain them amidst the trials of life and who continues the revelation they have received in Jesus.

Serve the Lord with Joy

First Reading: Acts 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second Reading: 1 Cor 12:3-7 12-13

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

Gospel: Jn 20:19-23

In the evening of the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

'As the Father sent me,
so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit.

For those whose sins you forgive,

they are forgiven;

for those whose sins you retain,

they are retained.'

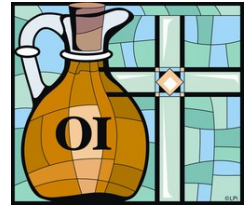

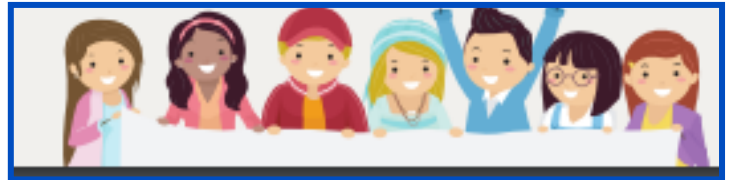
