Second Sunday of Easter—Year B 7th April 2024
Divine Mercy Sunday



John 20:19-31 recounts the profound encounter between Jesus and his disciples after his resurrection. At first, the disciples are locked in a room, filled with fear and uncertainty about the future. Yet, in the midst of their anxiety, Jesus appears to them, offering words of peace and reassurance. His presence alone dispels their doubts and fills them with a renewed sense of hope.

Thomas, one of the disciples, is notably absent during this initial encounter. When he hears of Jesus' appearance, he expresses scepticism, stating that he will not believe unless he sees and touches the wounds of Jesus. However, when Jesus appears again and invites Thomas to touch his wounds, Thomas is overcome with belief, exclaiming "My Lord and my God!" This moment illustrates the transformative power of encountering the risen Christ firsthand. It demonstrates how even the most sceptical among us can be moved to profound faith when faced with the reality of Jesus' love and resurrection.

This passage inspires reflection on the nature of love and faith. Jesus' love for his disciples is unconditional and unwavering, even in the face of their doubts and fears. His willingness to meet them where they are, to offer them peace and reassurance, speaks volumes about the depth of his love. It reminds us that no matter how far we may stray or how uncertain we may feel, Jesus is always there, ready to embrace us with his love and grace.

Moreover, Thomas' journey from doubt to belief serves as a powerful reminder that faith is not always instantaneous. It is a process, often marked by moments of questioning and uncertainty. Yet, when we open ourselves to be touched by his love and grace, our doubts can be transformed into faith, and our fears into peace.

In our own lives, we are called to emulate the love and faithfulness of Jesus. We are called to be beacons of hope in a world filled with doubt and despair, to offer peace and reassurance to those who are struggling. And we are called to approach our own doubts and uncertainties with humility and openness, trusting that in the end, love will always triumph over fear, and faith will always lead us to new life.

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 4:32-35

The whole group of believers was united, heart and soul; no one claimed for his own use anything that he had, as everything they owned was held in common.

The apostles continued to testify to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus with great power, and they were all given great respect.

None of their members was ever in want, as all those who owned land or houses would sell them, and bring the money from them, to present it to the apostles; it was then distributed to any members who might be in need.

Second Reading: 1 John 5:1-6

Whoever believes that Jesus is the Christ has been begotten by God; and whoever loves the Father that begot him

and whoever loves the Father that begot him loves the child whom he begets.

We can be sure that we love God's children if we love God himself and do what he has commanded us:

this is what loving God is – keeping his commandments; and his commandments are not difficult, because anyone who has been begotten by God

has already overcome the world; this is the victory over the world – our faith.

Who can overcome the world?

Only the man who believes that Jesus is the Son of God:

Jesus Christ who came by water and blood, not with water only,

but with water and blood;

with the Spirit as another witness – since the Spirit is the truth.



Gospel Reading: John 20:19-31

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.'

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit.
For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.
