10: For the Ten Commandments.
12: The number of Apostles.
13: The number of people sitting at the table of Jesus on the night of the Last Supper.
40: There are many references to the number forty. The rains of the flood lasted forty days and forty nights; the Israelites wandered in the desert for forty years and were held hostage by the Philistines for the same period of time; Moses was on Mt Sinai for forty days; Christ spent forty days in the wilderness.
100: One hundred suggest plenitude.
1000: One thousand signifies eternity.
