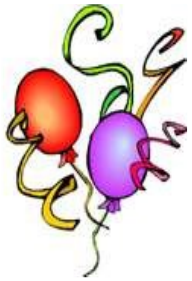

SEEING AND BELIEVING IN GOD'S LOVE AND MERCY

Today's gospel passage comes to us courtesy of John, who explores the meaning behind the Old Testament story (*Numbers*) of the 'bronze serpent'. According to the story, the Israelites were unhappy with their lot in the desert, particularly with the quality of and lack of food. For this they kept on complaining to both Moses and God. Unfortunately their situation had worsened with the outbreak of a plague of poisonous snakes, whose bite had already killed a considerable number of them. The people interpreted this as a direct punishment from God for their sins and their complaining.

They naturally turned to Moses, no longer complaining but asking for help. Moses, of course turned to God, who suggests a practical remedy. Moses was asked to make a large bronze snake, attach it to a long stick, and set it on high ground, where it could be seen from all quarters. Whenever a person was bitten by one of these snakes, all they had to do was look at the bronze snake to find healing. And so it happened: the bronze serpent was lifted up, and those who *looked at it found life*.

John believed that *seeing and believing in God's love and mercy* are at the heart of what the story is all about. Relying on his awareness that members of his Christian community remembered the story of the serpent very well, he made a connection that just as the serpent *was lifted up, and the people found life, so Jesus was lifted up, and those who believe in him will find life*. For John *seeing is believing, and believing leads to life*.

With Easter just around the corner, we could choose to reflect on the message in the last couple of lines of the Gospel passage: "*Those who live by the truth come into the light, that it may be plainly seen that their deeds have been done in God.*"
